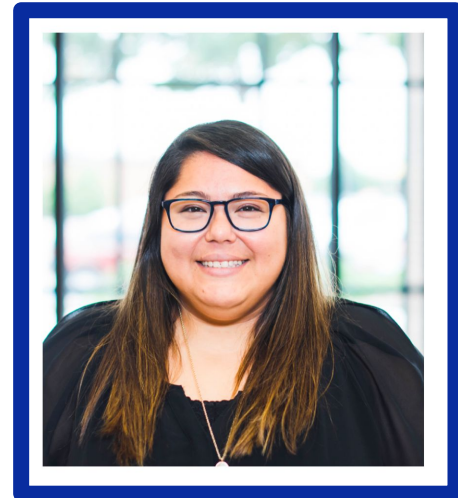

Morning Arrival

Second graders will wait outside their classrooms in the morning. They will sit down in the hallway and a teacher will be on hallway duty to monitor the students.

Afternoon Dismissal

MARQUEE WALKERS- Walkers and bikers that will be crossing Bruton Orand are "Marquee Walkers" and will exit out the end of the 2nd grade hallway and walk around to the marquee.

CAFETERIA WALKERS- Walkers and bikers that will be heading out Kenwood will exit out of the cafeteria.

CAR RIDERS- Car riders will come out the 2nd grade dismissal door and sit in lines near the flagpole. Older siblings will wait with their younger siblings. Please make sure you have your car tag hanging from your rear view mirror and pull all the way forward.

Your child's safety is our top priority. Please have a designated place (tree, bike rack, flagpole) to meet your child after school. No child will be released to another parent unless that parent either has the car rider id tag or that person is listed in Skyward as a designated pick up person. **Also, please notify us with any dismissal changes before 2:00 p.m. if possible.**

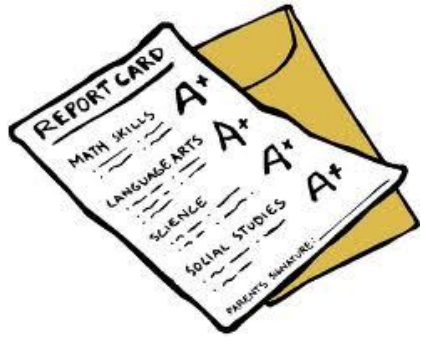

Classroom Management

- Your child's take home folder with behavior chart will come home daily so you can monitor classroom behavior. Each teacher handles this differently. Your teacher will explain their procedures in the classroom.
- If you leave something for your child, please send the teacher an email to let her know that something has been left.



Grading

- LISD will be using Skyward again this year for our grading program. Please be sure to check your child's grades periodically throughout the nine weeks to monitor progress.
- Report cards are available every nine weeks. We'll inform you when they're open in Skyward for you to view.
- We follow the district guidelines for reteaching and retesting. While we work diligently to reteach all concepts until they are mastered, we only retest a student who has failed a MAJOR test. They may retest for a potential grade of a 70. Daily work and quizzes are not subject to retesting.

*****Absences**

Regular attendance is one of the most important indicators of academic success.

The district will accept no more than 8 parent notes in a school year to excuse an illness, personal, or pre-approved absence. No more than 6 notes may be used in a semester. Any additional absences will require a note from a health care provider or documentation of an absence exempt from compulsory attendance, in order to be excused. The pre-arranged absence requests are grouped in with the 8 allowed parent absences per year. Doctors' notes do not count with the 8 parent notes per year.

Perfect Attendance (NEW) - LISD has defined the following perfect attendance guidelines for Elementary: A perfect attendance award can only be earned if the student is present every day, for the entire school day, with no unexcused late arrivals and no early departures.



Birthdays and Snacks

- If you choose to send in a treat for your child's birthday, please also send in plates and napkins. We do not have these types of items on hand in the classroom. Please check with your child's teacher to see if a student in your class has a food allergy so we can be sure to keep all of our friends safe.
- Alternatives to the traditional birthday treats are anything that is individually wrapped or a small item such as a sparkly pencil.
- Snacks – Your child is encouraged to bring two HEALTHY snacks each day to class and a water bottle with a sport bottle top. Remember our lunch time is 12:40, so the kiddos get pretty hungry. Please remember that snacks should be finger food and not require a utensil to eat.

Communication



- Each teacher has a unique way to send information home. You should receive some type of Newsletter weekly. Many teachers also have a Facebook page. There is a grade level Facebook page with information from the PTA and Room Parents.
- Another great way to contact your child's teacher is via email. We all periodically check email throughout the day, however there are times when email is down or when your teacher is absent. If there is a last minute change to your child's pick up, please contact the office to make sure we get the message.

Volunteers

- We love our volunteers, and appreciate your time that you so generously give to our school. You are such a vital part to our success!
- LISD has a volunteer management system called VOLY. To volunteer on our campus, you will need to create a VOLY account. Without completing this important process, you are not able to volunteer in your child's classroom, at school, or chaperone on a field trip. Thank you for partnering with us! ***District Safety Protocol



STUDENT SAFETY

A critical ingredient in the safe school recipe is the classroom response to an incident at school. Weather events, fire, accidents, intruders and other threats to student safety are scenarios that are planned and trained for by students, teachers, staff and administration.

SRP

Our school is expanding the safety program to include the Standard Response Protocol - Extended (SRPx). The SRPx is based on these five actions: Lockout, Lockdown, Evacuate, Shelter and Hold. In the event of an emergency, the action and appropriate direction will be called on the PA.

LOCKOUT - "Get Inside, Lock Outside Doors"

LOCKDOWN - "Locks, Lights, Out of Sight"

EVACUATE - "To the Announced Location"

SHELTER - "For a Hazard Using a Safety Strategy"

TRAINING

LOCKOUT

GET INSIDE. LOCK OUTSIDE DOORS

Lockout is called when there is a threat or hazard outside of the school building.

STUDENTS:

- Return to inside of building
- Do business as usual

TEACHERS

- Recover students and staff from outside building
- Increased situational awareness
- Do business as usual
- Take roll, account for students



LOCKDOWN LOCKS, LIGHTS, OUT OF SIGHT

Lockdown is called when there is a threat or hazard inside the school building.

STUDENTS:

- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence

TEACHERS:

- Lock classroom door
- Lights out
- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Wait for First Responders to open door
- Take roll, account for students



EVACUATE TO A LOCATION

Evacuate is called to move students and staff from one location to another.

STUDENTS:

- Bring your phone
- Leave your stuff behind
- Form a single file line
- Show your hands
- Be prepared for alternatives during response.

TEACHERS:

- Grab roll sheet if possible
- Lead students to Evacuation Location
- Take roll, account for students



SHELTER FOR A HAZARD USING SAFETY STRATEGY

Shelter is called when the need for personal protection is necessary.

SAMPLE HAZARDS:

- Tornado
- Hazmat

SAMPLE SAFETY STRATEGIES:

- Evacuate to shelter area
- Seal the room

STUDENTS:

- Appropriate hazards and safety strategies

TEACHERS:

- Appropriate hazards and safety strategies
- Take roll, account for students



HOLD IN YOUR CLASSROOM

Hold is called when the hallways need to be kept clear, even during class changes.

STUDENTS:

- Remain in your classroom
- Do business as usual.

TEACHERS:

- Recover students and staff from hallways
- Close and lock classroom door
- Take roll, account for students

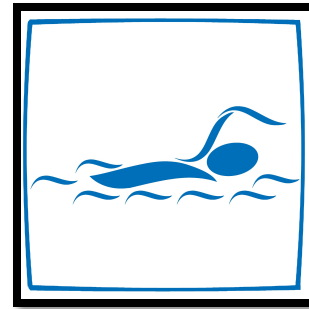

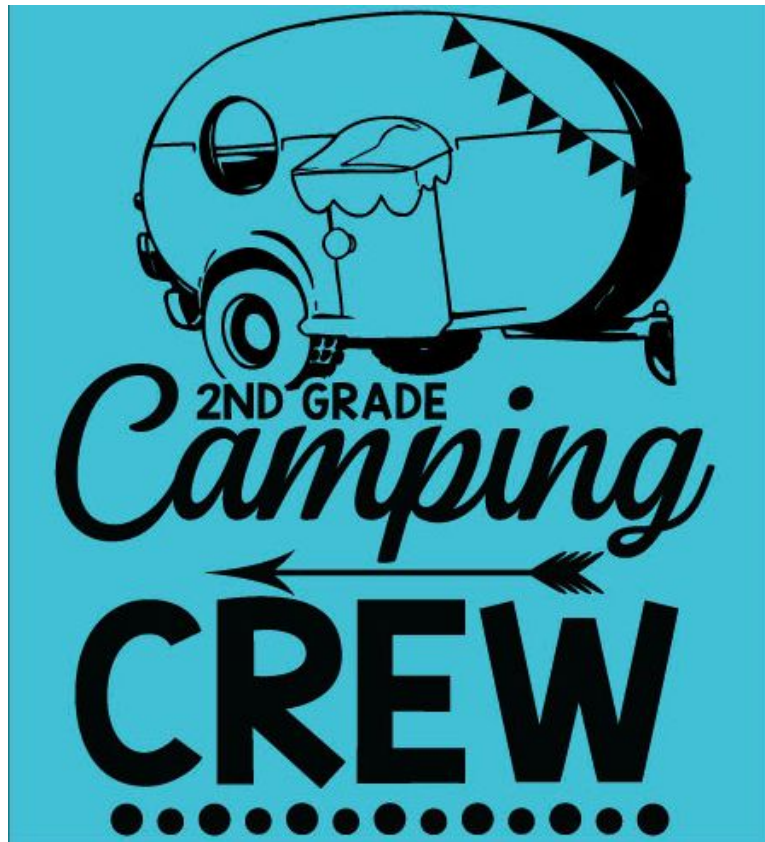
