- Grade access to all parents through Skyward

- Hosted on-line enrollment using campus technology several times during the year
- AVID is an option for students who are interested in attending a 4-year university upon graduation
- ACE is offered to all CIS students as a safe and encouraging place to be 5 days a week after school all year long
- After school tutoring and transportation is provided Monday through Thursday all year
