

WHEN DO I APPLY?

Early Decision

- You commit to attend if you are accepted
- You must cancel all other applications if accepted
- Ivy league/private
- Can only have 1 ED app pending at a time

Early Action

- Indicate your first choice college & receive notice early
- You are not committed to enroll
- Shows your interest in the school

Priority Deadline

- Increase odds of being admitted & receiving scholarships
- Encourages students to apply early
- Not binding
- Nov 1st for most public schools

Regular

- Deadlines usually Jan 1-March 15
- May apply to other colleges
- Runs into FAFSA priority deadline

Rolling Admissions

- Long window of time to apply
- Applications are evaluated as they come in
- Typical at community colleges






THE ANATOMY OF THE COLLEGE APP

- Counselor letter + 2 or 3 teachers
- Give your teachers AT LEAST 2 weeks to write your letters
- Provide teachers with deadlines, addresses, resume, transcript, etc.
- Request made online within the application or mail



Many colleges require letters of recommendation from teachers or other adults who know you well. Ask your references well in advance of the deadlines to write you a recommendation. You may want to give them a short written summary of your achievements to help them write about you.



THE ANATOMY OF THE COLLEGE APPLICA

- Ask others to proofread (teacher, parents, friends, me)
- Apply Texas has 3 essays but some colleges require their own essays

Essay A:

Tell us your story. What unique opportunities or challenges have you experienced throughout your high school career that have shaped who you are today?

Essay B:

Most students have an identity, an interest, or a talent that defines them in an essential way. Tell us about yourself.

Essay C:

You've got a ticket in your hand – Where will you go? What will you do? What will happen when you get there?

THE ANATOMY OF THE COLLEGE APP

- If you are eligible for free/reduced lunch you receive 4 application fee waivers when you register for SAT/ACT using a fee waiver (get from counseling office)
- Read college website for how to submit a fee waiver



Application Fees

College application fees vary, but generally it costs from \$35 to \$50 to apply to each college. Fees are nonrefundable. Many colleges offer fee waivers (that is, they don't require the fee) to students who can't afford to pay. If you need application fee waivers, speak with your college counselor or principal.



Your High School Transcript

The record of the classes you've taken and your grades is one of the most important parts of your application. Your high school should send your transcript, along with a school profile, directly to the colleges you are applying to. Ask your counselor or principal how to arrange for this. And be sure to check the transcript for errors before it's sent.



ADMISSION TEST SCORES

- Colleges require Official Scores sent directly from SAT or ACT
- Register & send scores online
- You may need SAT Subject Tests for private or Ivy League schools





Federal Student Aid

Who fills it out?

- ALL Students applying to a college (community & career schools too!)
- Students with a valid Social Security Number (otherwise, possibly TASFA)

When do you fill it out?

- Beginning October 1 st in the year prior to your education (every year)
- Ex: October 1, 2019 for FAFSA 2020-2021 school year, using 2018 tax return
- Don't miss the school's Priority Deadline (first -come, first serve)
- This is just the <u>first</u> step, so check your emails from the college
- Private & selective colleges may require the CSS Profile too

Complete the FAFSA/TASFA with US!

Bring the following:

- Student and parent(s) SSN (if applicable)
- Student's Alien Registration number, if not a US Citizen
