Lewisville Independent School District

Lewisville Independent School District encompasses more than 127 square miles. Hebron High School is one of five high schools, 5 nine and ten grade centers, 15 middle schools, 41 elementary schools, 2 career centers, one alternative school, and one-night school. LISD is one of the largest school districts in Texas.

The Academic Year

Hebron High School uses an accelerated block schedule. The school year is divided into two terms: August – December and January – May with two semesters in each term. One half credit may be earned per class each 9 weeks. Students may earn up to 4 credits per term or 8 credits per school year. Each school day includes four 90-minute class periods.

Grade Point and Rank in Class

Grades are recorded numerically. Rank in class is calculated on the core classes of English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Foreign Language, Ac Dec and AP. Core courses are weighted by a factor of 1.1, 1.15, 1.2, or 1.0 times the awarded grade, depending on of the level of the course described in the curriculum guide.

The LISD default is to post a student's class rank on the transcript. Students in the Top 10 percent, or students who do not complete the opt-out form, will have their class rank posted on their transcripts. Students not in the Top 10 percent may choose to opt-out of having the rank appear on their transcript.

COVID-19 Grading

During the Spring Semester 4th 9 weeks grading period of the 2020-21 school year. LISD students were awarded either a Pass(P) or Fail(F) in order to determine credit for the course. These grades were not calculated in GPA or Rank.
