

LISD FINANCIAL OUTLOOK

N the last 22 years, LISD's tax rate has decreased from \$1.61 in 2000 to \$1.23 in 2022.

According to the 2020 report on Texas Smart Schools, LISD received four out of five stars, ranking very high in academic progress, at or above 83% of all Texas school districts.

Compared to other school districts in our area and others our size in Texas, LISD starts with less money per student, spends more on instruction and campus operations, less on central administration and payroll and ends with a lower cost per student.

LISD budgets to pay off debt from bond funds in just 20 years, compared to most school districts that have longer amortization periods.
