
Benefits of a School-Wide Title 1 Program

- School-wide programs have great latitude to determine how to organize their operations and allocate the multiple funding sources available to them. They do not have to identify particular children as eligible for services or separately track federal dollars. Instead, school wide programs can use all allocated funds to increase the amount and quality of learning time. In this way, they can embrace a high-quality curriculum, according to a comprehensive plan, that ensures all children meet the state's challenging academic standards.
- School-wide programs serve all children in a school. All staff, resources, and classes are part of the overall school-wide program. The purpose is to generate high levels of academic achievement in core subject areas for all students, especially those students most in need. This purpose is achieved through:
 - 1. High quality instruction.
 - Comprehensive reform strategies and methods that are based on the use of scientifically-based research.
 - 3. Strategies and methods to improve teacher quality and professional development.
 - 4. Consolidated use of funds.



Parent Rights

- Parents have the right to know the
 professional qualifications of their
 child's teachers, including the degrees
 and certifications held, and whether
 the teacher is certified in their
 respective area of instruction.
- Parents have the right to know the school improvement status of the school.
- Parents have the right to know the achievement level of their child in each area according to state assessments.
- Parents have the right to know if their child has been assigned, or has been taught, for at least four consecutive weeks by a teacher who does not meet the highly qualified definition.

Title I Defined

Purpose: Title I funds supplement the local and state educational programs to ensure student achievement in all academic areas. The Title I program offers a variety of services which may include additional teachers and support staff, extra time for instruction, a variety of teaching methods and materials, smaller classes, and additional training for staff. Qualifications: Schools qualify for funds based on economic need. Lewisville ISD follows the school-wide Title I program design.

School-Wide Requirements:

- Comprehensive Needs Assessment which identifies areas of greatest need.
- School-wide reform strategies such as:
 - 1. Strengthen the core academic program.
 - 2. Increase the amount and quality of learning time.
 - 3. Meet the needs of underserved populations.
 - 4. Address needs of all learners.
 - 5. Instruction by "highly qualified" teachers.
 - 6. Professional learning for teachers.
 - 7. Parent involvement strategies.
