# CCMR-What is it?

- College, Career & Military Readiness
  - We want students to <u>have a plan</u>
- Important component of how schools and districts are evaluated
- Credits, Endorsements and STAAR passage are "graduation requirements"
- Every student completing a CCMR indicator is a "graduation goal"
- Current stats (will be higher by end of the school year)
  - 10th graders: 15%
  - 11th graders: 30%
  - 12th graders: 60%
- Could impact your student during high school or immediately after depending on their goals



# CCMR-How to meet it?

Students need to meet 1 of the following criteria by the time they graduate

- Score 3 on any AP Exam in grades 9-12
- Complete Dual Credit Courses
  - 3 hours of Dual Credit English or Math OR
  - 9 hours of Dual Credit across any subject
- Complete an aligned CTE Program of Study which includes...
  - Complete 3 or more courses for 4+ credits
  - Earn credit in 1+ Level 3 or Level 4 course
  - Earn the culminating Industry-Based Certification in the Program of Study
- Enlist in the US Armed Forces or the TX National Guard
- Students receiving Special Education services complete an endorsement

# Virtual Learning Academy:

- ✓ Online learning: core & electives- Over 60 courses, 9 AP Courses
- ✓ Why take these courses?
- ✓ Available year round (Fall, Spring, Summer & 5th period)
- ✓ Fees?
- ✓ Register for next Fall/Spring
  - Consult Campus Counselor
  - Request VLA through Skyward Family Access

### **Honors & AP Courses:**

- ✓ creates a climate of academically motivated students
- ✓ goes deeper into the TEKS but has same curriculum as regular class
- ✓ may involve more study time outside of class (but tends to have fewer homework worksheets, etc)
- ✓ carries a weighted multiplier towards GPA:
  - AP- Level 3 Honors- Level 2 Regular- Level 1
- ✓ consider <u>balance</u> in coursework & other activities when weighing options
- ✓ uses Level-Down guidelines if needed (after 3 weeks or 9 weeks)
- ✓ AP courses offer an AP test at the end of the course for approx \$100 for college credit, depending on student's score



### **Dual Credit Courses:**

- ✓ earn MHS credit & NCTC college hours simultaneously
- ✓ courses taught at MHS, Online, or with NCTC
- ✓ Courses available during school year and/or summer
- ✓ Excellent tuition value \$55 per credit hour
- ✓ Grades post to NCTC & LISD transcript
- ✓ Counts as the highest multiplier in GPA
- ✓ helps students understand college courses now
- ✓ Select Dual Credit courses during Student Registration to begin Dual Credit application process

- Course selection will be completed by the STUDENTS in Student Access of Skyward.
- Parents will be able to see their students' selections in Family Access.
- The Master Schedule is finalized based on student choices during course selection, so it is is critical to make sure to choose course levels
   & electives that your student will be interested in taking
- Counselors try very hard to schedule first choices of electives. Please understand that when choices are not available, we do our best choose from alternates.
- It is likely your student will have a course on the main campus.
