- ★ 3 college hours is the equivalent to a 0.5 high school credit upon successful completion of the course (unless otherwise stated by NCTC).
- ★ Dual Credit grades will average in the GPA (Eng, Math, Sci, and SS).
- ★ Multiplier for Dual Credit courses is 1.2
- ★ Students must APPLY and be accepted to NCTC.
