Registration Instructions

Online Skyward registration opens February 3rd, and is due in the Student's Skyward by February 6th.

Use the information below to plan out your course requests, and then enter your requests in your Student Skyward February 3rd - 6th.

Steps

1. Review your transcript located in your Student Skyward Portfolio to determine your needed courses.

Quick reference of recommended courses:

- 4 English Credits
- 4 Math Credits
- 4 Science Credits
- 4 Social Studies Credits
- 1 P.E. Credit
- 2 Credits of a language other than English (recommended to take both in the same year)
- 1 Fine Arts Credit
- 6 Credits of Electives/Endorsements

- 26 total credits needed to graduate

2. Refer to the Core Course page and fill in your four core courses.
3. Refer to the Elective Course page and fill in four credits of electives.
4. Carefully select three 1.0 alternate classes, and four .5 alternate classes.

Note: If alternates are not entered in Skyward, an alternate choice will be made for you.

5. Login to your STUDENT Skyward account. The same courses and alternate courses you filled in on your Skyward planning sheet must be entered into Skyward.

College Career & Military Readiness (CCMR)

What is CCMR?

- College, Career, & Military Readiness (CCMR) is about preparing students for life after graduation and is integrated into the everyday culture of LISD.
- Readiness for the next step after high school - College, Career, or Military - is the culmination of a K-12 culture of high expectations, opportunities to engage in challenging coursework, and career exploration.

How to earn CCMR?

LISD strives for each graduate to meet **at least one** of the College, Career & Military Readiness (CCMR) indicators below through high school programming.

- Meet specific criteria on assessments of college readiness - SAT, ACT, or TSIA2
- Earn credit for the College Prep Math course offered to seniors
- Earn 3 hours of Dual Credit in Math or English
- Earn 9 hours of Dual Credit in any subject other than Math or English
- Earn a 3 or higher on an Advanced Placement (AP) exam in any subject area in grades 9-12
- Earn an Associate's Degree while in high school
- Complete a sequence of Career & Technical Education (CTE) coursework and earn the Industry-Based Certification
 - **Note:** CTE pathways and course options can be found on the Elective Course Card. Classes can be taken at Marcus, TECC-W and TECC-E.
- Enlist in the United States Armed Forces or National Guard after graduation

Credits and Accelerated Block

What is a Credit?

- A credit is earned when a student successfully completes a course of study.
- In order to earn a credit, a student must pass the course with an average of 70 or higher AND must be present in class 90% of the time also known as "seat time".

Earning Credits

- A student must earn at least 26 state credits (in specific courses) in order to graduate.
- Each 9 weeks, or quarter, a student may earn a half credit in each course.
- A student may earn 1 credit per 18 week term per course.
- If a student passes all courses they have the potential of earning 8 credits per academic year.

What is Accelerated Block?

- There are four blocks (class periods) a day. Students attend these four classes everyday for 90 minutes.
- Students take four courses during the fall term and four different courses during the spring term.
- Grading periods are 9 weeks in length instead of 6 weeks. Progress reports are given every 3 weeks.
- There are four 9 week grading periods in one academic year--two 9 week grading periods in the fall and two 9 week grading periods in the spring.
- 9 weeks = 1 quarter = 1/2 credit = 1 semester
- 18 weeks = 1 term = 1 credit
- Students complete one entire course of study such as English I in an 18 week period or term.
- Students may take two 9 week courses during one term earning 1/2 for each course. (ex. Comm. Applications Fall 1/ Health Fall 2)
