4. Indicate “yes,” to be signed directly into a new Choices 360 account





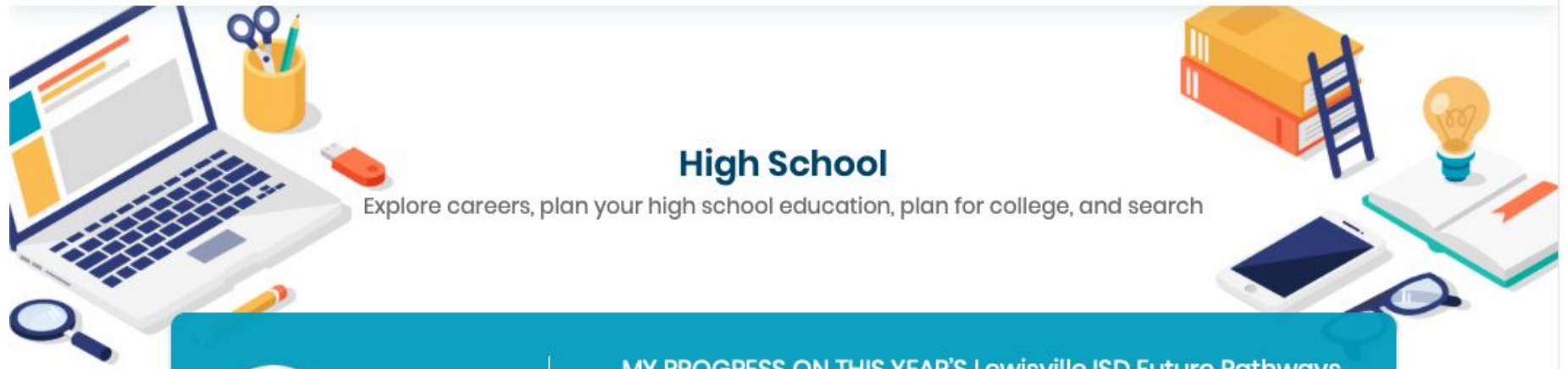

College Application Requirements

- **Application**
 - Check university website for application link. Some application websites:
 - Common App
 - Apply Texas
 - Coalition
 - Individual School Application, found on their website
 - Plan for deadlines
 - Essays
 - Opportunity for student to tell their story
 - **Send Official Transcript**
 - Request official transcript through the **Transcript Request Link** on MHS website
 - Registrar in A103 if you have any questions
 - **Send ACT/SAT Test Scores**
 - Must be sent from the testing institution to the college
 - Community College can use scores to be exempt from the TSI
 - **Recommendation letters**
 - Check to see if this is required
 - Provide teacher, or counselor senior brag sheet/resume 2 weeks before

RANK Opt-Out on Transcript

Two windows to have rank removed from transcript:

- May 2021 (end of junior year)
- September 2021 (beginning senior year)

Once the rank is removed from the transcript, it CANNOT go back on.

This is done on the parent portal of Skyward ONLY.

Factors in Your Decision

- Where are you applying?
- What do you need to be accepted?
- What are your current test scores, GPA, and rank?
- What has your admissions rep at the school suggested that you do?
- What else do you have that will be beneficial to the admissions process? (extracurricular, community service, etc)
- Pros/Cons based on your statistics and what is needed to be accepted

General Information:
Lewisville Independent School District is now offering a secure website for corporations, post-secondary institutions and military recruiters to request student records online.
District policy and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) student records are only available to those who have authorization from the student or parent, guardian or responsible person if the student is less than 18 years of age. If the student is 18 years of age or older, school records will not be released to a parent, guardian, or responsible person without the student's written consent.

Please note the information below:

- Requests for information must be completed online and will be processed on normal business days during normal business hours (Monday-Friday 8:00 AM - 4:00 PM).
- Phone, Email and fax requests will no longer be accepted.
- **OFFICIAL transcripts are ONLY sent to colleges/universities/employers. Any student/parent request, will be sent an unofficial copy of the transcript.**
- **Select the 'Final Transcript' box on the form ONLY if you are a graduating senior AND are requesting your final transcript be sent to the college you are attending.**
- High school transcript requests require a copy of the student signed release to be uploaded during the ordering process.
- Education verifications will be delivered to the email address used during the ordering process.
- You will receive emails from scribOnline@scribsoft.com to notify you of the status of your order. It is important you read those emails carefully as additional information may be required to process your request.
- Please allow 7-10 days for processing.
- **Click the appropriate link button to request information.**

TSI (Texas Success Initiative)

- ❖ The Texas Success Initiative (TSI) measures the ability of students, as indicated by their skills in Reading, Writing and Math, to do college-level course work.
 - ❖ No matter what college or university students attend, TSI (or school equivalent) is required for students to take before registering for college courses.
 - ❖ TSI can be taken at the college or university the student plans to attend, or any college that allows outside testers. UNT in Denton is a known school that allows students to take TSI regardless if student attends UNT or not. Marcus will host TSI testing one time in spring semester for all seniors who sign up.
 - ❖ Exemptions: Students can be exempt from taking TSI based off of SAT, ACT, PSAT, and/or STAAR scores. Check specific college or university websites for exemption qualifications.

College Visits

- 2 free excused absences during junior and senior year. Must bring back signed note/letter from admissions office with date of visit and school logo.
 - Many colleges visit Marcus! When school is in session, students can sign-up for small group college info sessions in the Counseling Center.
 - Our annual spring (*in-person*) college fair has been canceled. However we will have a virtual College Forum on April 22nd from 6pm - 7pm. Link will be provided to log in via email.
