GRADE POINT VALUES AND CLASS RANK

In order to provide an equitable evaluation for courses of varying difficulty, a weighted grade system is used for computation of class rank. All grades earned in the areas of English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Foreign Language, any AP Course, and ACDEC will be used to determine rank in class and GPA. Within these areas, difficulty levels are assigned to every course. Grades are weighted with a multiplier according to the assigned level as follows: level 3 is 1.2; level 2 is 1.15; level 1 is 1.1; level 0 is 1.0. The computed score is then totaled and divided by the number of foundation courses taken. These averages will be placed in numerical order from highest to lowest to determine *top ten percent*.

In response to the highly competitive academic settings of LISD schools, the Board of Trustees enacted a policy for students who do not rank in the top ten percent. It is the policy (EIC local) of Lewisville ISD;

A student whose class rank is not in the top ten percent of a graduating class shall indicate whether the district should or should not report the student's class rank on the transcript.

Therefore, students in the top ten percent of their class will show class rank on their transcript. Students who are not in the top ten percent of their class may not show a rank on their transcript. For these reasons, please consider students without a rank to be from a non-ranking school.

In 2020, the FMHS Orchestra placed $1^{\rm st}$ in the zone & Top Ten in the state at the TMEA Honor Orchestra Competition.

FMHS Girls Volleyball was 6A State Champions in 2018.

FMHS Boys Soccer was 6A State Champions in 2019.

FMHS Girls Cross Country named State Champions in 2020 & 2021. FMHS Girls Track earned 1st in State in 2022.

Class of 2022 was awarded over \$46,800,000 in scholarship money.

In 2022 FMHS Cheer was finalist at State competition and semi-finalists at Nationals. FMHS Cheer finished 8^{th} in the Nation.

FMHS Robotics Team has multiple State, National, and World placers in both Vex Robotics and TSA Robotics.

Texas Association of Future Educators had students place 3rd & 7th at Nationals. Two FMHS students have been named Student of the Year, and our teacher was awarded Teacher of the Year in 2022.

FMHS DECA had 16 members advance to the State Career Development Conference with six of the students then advancing to the International Conference.

FMHS Theatre has appeared at the State UIL One Act Play Contest 5 times and placed 4 times, winning the Samuel French Award for acting twice.

In 2022, 619 National Honor Society members at FMHS recorded over 48,000 hours of community service. Forty-four students accrued more than 100 hours of service each.

FMHS Choir has over 50 participants in the Texas All-State choirs. They have performed in 7 different countries and consistently receive UIL Sweepstakes Awards.

SCHOOL DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY

The Lewisville Independent School District is an urban/suburban district and encompasses more than 130 square miles. Flower Mound High School is one of 5 high schools, 15 middle schools, 39 elementary schools, 1 early childhood center, 2 career centers and 2 alternative schools. LISD is one of the fastest growing districts in the nation with a current enrollment of over 50,000. The Flower Mound attendance zone includes students residing in Flower Mound and a small portion of Lewisville. These communities are located about 35 minutes north of downtown Dallas between Lake Lewisville and Lake Grapevine.

Flower Mound High School opened its doors for the first time in August 1999 with a student body comprised of 9th and 10th graders. 11th grade was added for the 2000-2001 school year, and 12th grade was added in 2001-2002. In 2014-2015 an addition was added to house our FM 9th campus. THE GRADING SYSTEM

All grades are recorded numerically. Transfer grades are recorded from transcripts and are given numerical equivalence according to LISD grading scale if the sending school does not send a scale.

GRADE SCALE: A 90-100 C 70-79 B 80-89 F 0-69

School Year: LISD high schools are on an accelerated block schedule. The school year is divided into two terms (August-December and January-May) with two quarters in each term. One half credit can be earned per class per quarter. Students may earn four credits per term or eight credits per year.

<u>School Day</u>: Four class periods of 90 minutes each, which meet five days per week. Hours – 8:20-3:35 Monday-Friday.

COVID 19 IMPACT

In response to the global pandemic, Lewisville ISD (LISD) shifted to full online learning for the remainder of the 2019-2020 school year. Due to the unprecedented nature of this global crisis and its impact on learning, LISD implemented a pass/fail (P/F) grading system to award students credit for courses in the remainder of the 2019-2020 school year. GPA for all students in grades 9-12 was frozen at the end of the 3rd nine weeks grading period of the school year 2019-2020.
