What is an Endorsement?

- There are 5 areas students can choose from:
 - Arts and Humanities
 - Business and Industry
 - Multidisciplinary Studies
 - Public Service
 - Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM)



Arts and Humanities



- Students interested in the performing arts of music and theatre, as well as the visual arts, may find this endorsement suitable for them.
- Possible career paths and interest areas include courses related to:
 - Political Science, World Languages, Cultural Studies,
 English Literature, History, and Fine Arts.



Business and Industry



- Possible career paths and interest areas may include:
 - Database Management; Information Technology, Communications, Accounting, Finance, Marketing, Graphic Design, Architecture, Construction, Welding, Logistics, Automotive Technology, and Agricultural Science.



Multidisciplinary Studies



 All career pathways identified in all cluster and endorsement areas would fall into the multidisciplinary endorsement area.

Multidisciplinary Studies



Requirements

A coherent sequence or series of CTE courses from one of the areas:

- Option A: Advanced Courses (4 from other endorsement areas)
- Option B: Four by Four (4 credits in each foundation subject area, including English IV and chemistry and/or physics)
- Option C: AP, IB, or DC (4 credits in Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, or dual credit selected from English, mathematics, science, social studies, economics, LOTE or fine arts)



Public Service



• Students will enroll in courses directly related to health science, education, law enforcement, culinary arts, hospitality and the armed forces.

Human Services include careers in nursing, medical assistance, hospital administration, nutrition, clergy, counseling, etc.

Law Enforcement and Public Safety include careers such as a mediator, law clerk, paralegal, detective, security guard, criminal investigator, bailiff, and fish and game warden.

Education includes careers such as a teacher, athletic trainer, principal, college professor, school psychologist, diagnostician, or counselor.

Students interested in a career with the military may also choose to pursue this endorsement with the JROTC program in one of the following areas: Army (TCHS), Air Force (FMHS/MHS), & Navy (HHS/LHS)

STEM



- Students need to complete courses directly related to:
 - Environmental Science, Technology, Engineering,
 Advanced Mathematics, and Computer Science.
- May be the right pathway for a student interested in careers such as:
 - a biochemist, bioengineer, civil engineer, pharmacist, nurse, psychiatrist, anesthesiologist, orthodontist, lab technician, scientist, medical assistant, and forensic science technician.

CAREER PLANS



- Now we will use your selected Endorsement to start your Career Plan. You will use a template based on the Endorsement you select; it will insert classes that correspond with your Endorsement for 9th-12 grades.
- 9th grade- shows classes you are registered for; remove extra
- 10th-12th grade- look over classes template inserted
- Keep in mind classes are simply place holders (regular, PreAP doesn't matter)
- Go ahead and add any classes you plan to take all 4 years like band, orchestra, athletics, etc.
- Save and electronically sign it.
