Remember to check those vaccine records!

Where Can I Get My Child Vaccinated?



1. Your regular medical provider, drop-in clinics, pharmacies

2. Denton County Public Health can vaccinate any child 0-18 years through the TVFC program as long as he/she meets at least ONE of the following:

- Covered on CHIP/Medicaid
- Uninsured
- Alaskan Native or American Indian
- UNDERinsured (see definition below)
- * We can also vaccinate *uninsured* college students

Underinsured Definition: 1) A child whose health insurance does *not* include vaccines; or 2) A child whose insurance covers only *selected* vaccines - DCHD can provide only the vaccines that are not covered; or 3) A child whose insurance caps vaccine coverage at a certain amount, and the parent has already met that cap.

What Should I Bring?

- **Complete** shot record for each child (a school nurse note is NOT sufficient)
- Medicaid or CHIP cards
- Cash or card, if you are uninsured or underinsured—\$10 per vaccine, max of \$30.(TB test: additional \$10)
- Print and complete patient paperwork here: dentoncounty.com/immunizations
- Books, magazines, tablets, toys, etc. for entertainment (wait times may be long, as this is the busiest time of year for immunizations)

When Should I Take My Child In?

Immediately. If you wait too long, your child may not receive the vaccines needed for school in time.
