- · Minority students are encouraged to apply.

Letter of Recommendation should be provided from either of the following:

• A teacher or school official (written on official letterhead), OR a community leader.

Addendum

Until her death in May 2011, Mrs. Bernice Griffin was a faithful, dedicated, committed and functioning member of Morse Street Baptist Church, Denton, TX. Mrs. Griffin had to overcome many obstacles just to attend church—an amputee with reoccurring health and mobility issues. Despite the obstacles, she was faithful in her work, in her home and in her church. Mrs. Griffin also completed her bachelor's degree after raising five children to adulthood. She continued to serve as a role model for her family, coworkers, and community. Bernice Griffin was the wife of Mr. McKinley Griffin (deceased 2016) for more than 62 years and raised five daughters. Mrs. Griffin was a Diamond Life member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., and a member of Denton County Alumnae Chapter where she devoted her service to the educational, spiritual and social development of all who were blessed to cross her path.

Addendum

Marilyn Hunt Williams was a beloved retired educator who left behind a legacy of service. At the time of her death in August 2014, Marilyn Williams served on the Delta Public Service Foundation Board of Directors and was a Golden Life Member of Delta Sigma Theta, Sorority, Inc. Mrs. Williams was an active member of Antioch Christian Fellowship in Corinth, TX where she served faithfully in several ministries including but not limited to Antioch ARMS (Community Outreach Food Ministry), and the Lifepoint Home Group Ministry. She also served in her community, coordinating the Life Learning Education classes at the Salvation Army. Marilyn Williams mentored young girls in the local school district. The fact that Marilyn Hunt Williams was a quadriplegic, bound to a wheelchair for over 38 years, set no limits on her service to others.
