



#### FOUNDATION Scholarship

  - Good Academic Standing


#### **Payment Plans**

- Initiate in <u>Cougarweb</u> or call cashier's office at 972.377.1637


#### Preparing for Class: Textbooks





#### Netiquette Guidelines – This is not Twitter


#### • Do's

- Keep all postings to class-related content, such as the textbook readings, videos, and assignments.
- Use caution when discussing personal matters; the discussion board is for general comments.
- Ask each other for advice, suggestions, and tips to improve the quality of class work.
- Encourage each member of the class to do the best work possible.

#### • Don'ts

- Don't challenge or attack others; the discussions are meant to stimulate conversation, not create contention.
- Avoid all defamatory, profane, threatening, offensive, or illegal materials; do not post anything in a message that you would not want the world to see, or you would not want anyone to know came from you.
- Avoid using the discussion board as a forum for complaints; any relevant issues should be brought to the professor's attention in a private e-mail.
- Don't use inappropriate language toward other students and/or the professor.
- Any violation of the standards of appropriate behavior online will be reported to the Dean of Students and appropriate disciplinary action will be taken by the college.

# FERPA Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act

- Similar to HIPAA law.
- Federal law that ensures privacy of student educational records (begins when student starts college regardless of age).
- Collin College cannot share grades, course schedules, test scores, etc. with parents.
- A great opportunity for students to learn the college process and take on new responsibilities.
- Students can authorize confidential information to be released by completing a FERPA Authorization form.
- The FERPA Authorization is located on the student's CougarWeb account.
- This form is valid until the student revokes the authorization. There is no time limit for this form.




## College Grades

- College daily grades are reported in Canvas, NOT in Skyward
- Keep track of your grades as assignments are returned. Not all assignments are graded.
- In college courses, it is not abnormal to have only 4 graded assignments for the semester.
- STUDENTS (not parents), always, always, always communicate concerns regarding grades with your professor directly.

## Collin College Transcript

- Your final grade will remain on your Collin College Transcript
- You must send your official Collin College Transcript to all colleges you apply to.
- Maintain at least a 2.0 GPA to remain in Good Academic Standing (leads to Academic Warning, then Academic Probation)

- If you are not doing well in your course, reach out to your instructor, high school counselor, and the special admissions coordinator that works with your high school.

## College Expectations: No Plagiarism

• **Plagiarism** is using the ideas and/or words of others in your writing without clearly acknowledging the source.

• Whether plagiarism occurs intentionally or accidentally, ignorance is no defense; colleges have severe penalties for confirmed cases of plagiarism, made even easier to identify by

programs such as turnitin.com

## Types of Plagiarism

#### • Direct plagiarism:

- writing composed by a peer, friend, family member, or anyone else and submitted by a student with or without the writer's knowledge
- writing purchased from an individual or website (e.g., an online "paper mill")
- writing that is copied in whole or part from a website, book, article, film, broadcast, or any other published or unpublished source.

#### Self-plagiarism:

- you cannot "recycle" an essay for more than one class?
- All the writing you submit for a grade must be new writing composed for a specific class and assignment.

#### Mosaic plagiarism:

- Taking an excerpt from a source and replacing key words with synonyms to make the excerpt appear
  to be original work
- All paraphrased material should be followed by a citation.


#### Accidental plagiarism:

- The writer might misquote a source, forget to include a citation, cite the source incorrectly, or misunderstand how to paraphrase or quote a source.
- Even if you did not intend to plagiarize, you can be penalized.

#### What needs documentation?

- ANY information from an outside source, unless it is considered common knowledge for your audience.
- Facts, statistics, graphs, drawings, photographs, works of art.
- Ideas, opinions or interpretations by anyone other than you.
- Exact quotations from a source.
- Summaries or paraphrases of material from a source.




#### Library Resources

#### Writing in College: Popular sources

- Intended for the general reading audience
- Written in a way that does not require any specialized knowledge to read and understand.
- Shouldn't be your main source for research















## Writing in College: Scholarly sources





- Written for an audience of professional researchers
- Undergo a rigorous peer-review process prior to publication





- Articles describe the results of research studies
- Find online using Collin College Library databases via Cougarweb
