Dual Credit vs. AP

	Dual Credit	Advanced Placement (AP)
Description	Allows high school students to simultaneously earn college credit, while also earning credit for high school	Allows high school students to take college-level courses and exams to earn college credit or placement while still in high school
Credit	Guaranteed college credit upon successful completion of course(s) in Texas	Upon completion of course, must pass College Board AP Exam(s) with a score of 3 or higher
Teachers/Instructors	Taught by college instructors or high school teachers who serve as adjunct professors	Taught by high school teachers trained by College Board
College/University Acceptance	Accepted by public colleges and universities in Texas, as well as many colleges and universities across the nation. Check the policy at each college or university	Accepted throughout the nation. Check the policy at each university.
Location	Taught at LISD high schools or on the community college campus	Taught at LISD high schools
Eligibility	High School students must be meet TSI eligibility requirements	Open to any student

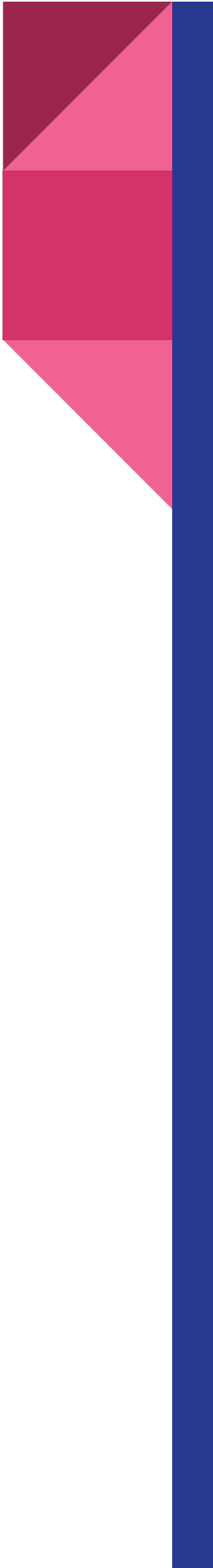
Course Selection

- Course selection materials will be available beginning Friday, February 12 in Advisory
- Students need to select courses totaling 8 credits and at least 4 alternate courses - alternate courses are often used. Select courses you would like to take
- Courses selected are to be input into Skyward by 11:59 PM on Sunday, Feb. 21.



Input Into Skyward

- Once students have selected courses, course requests need to be input directly into Skyward.
- Select courses in Skyward based on COURSE NUMBER
- Again, directions will be given on Friday in Advisory.
Everything this year is ONLINE



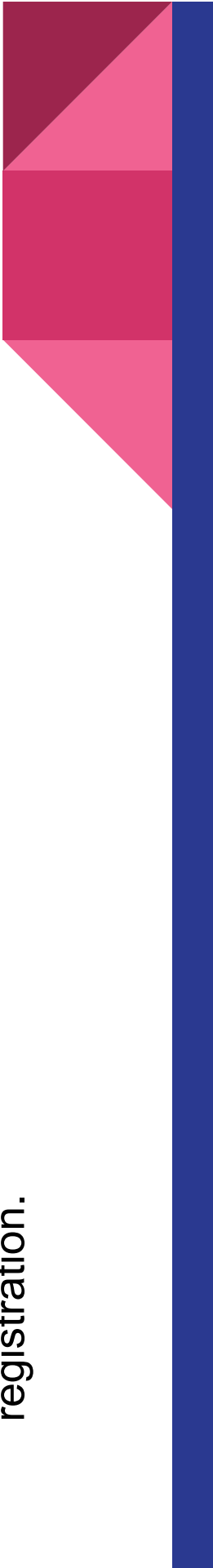
Core Curriculum

- English - 4 credits - taken each year
 - Math - 4 credits - should include Algebra 2
 - Science - 4 credits - should include either Chemistry or Physics
 - Social Studies - 3 credits - US History for 11th grade; Both Government AND Economics are required for 12th grade.
- These are 9-weeks courses



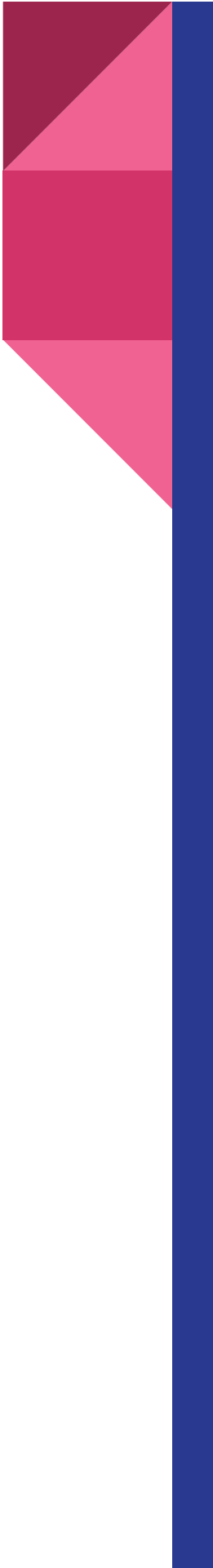
Ways to Earn Credit

- On-Level, Honors and AP courses at Hebron
- Virtual Learning Academy – VLA/TxVSN- Directions for registration found in Skyward. Hebron counselors will help with registration.
- Blended Courses – offered through VLA – Directions for registration found in Skyward. Hebron counselors will help with registration.
- Dual Credit – offered through Collin College. These courses must be registered through Collin College. Hebron counselors will help with registration.



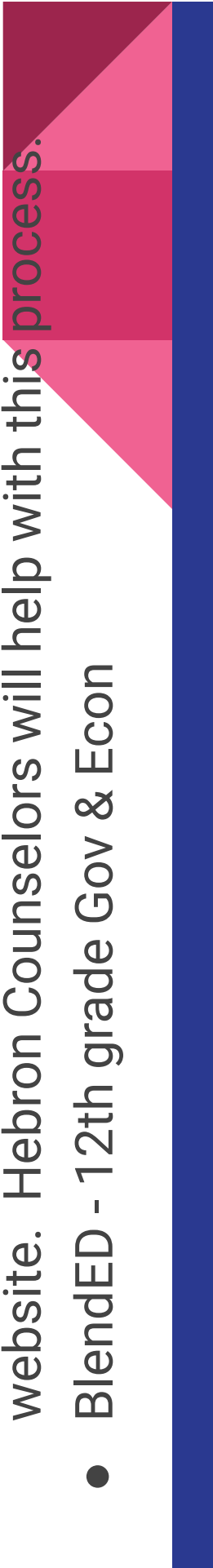
Honors, AP and On-Level

- Think about accelerated block and the stress-level of your student. 2-core courses fall and 2-core spring are not a guarantee
- Heavy course loads, programs, career center courses or athletics can cause one semester to load heavier than another



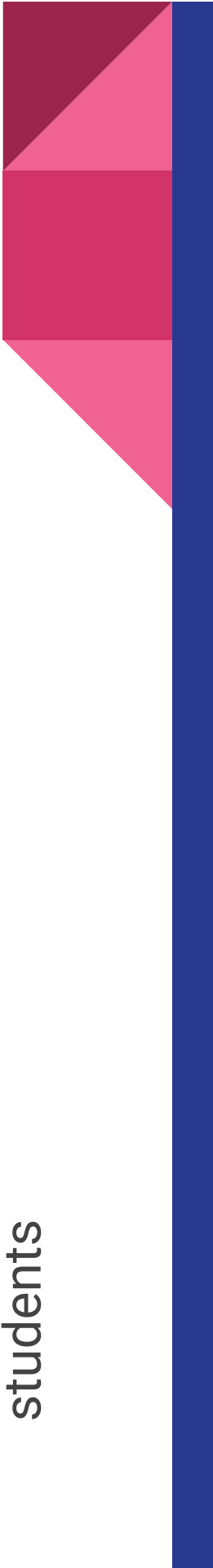
Virtual Learning Academy (VLA)

- District offers Online Courses
- Courses can be taken INSIDE and OUTSIDE the school day
- INSIDE the school day-- Course is either 1st, 3rd or 4th period; the expectation is that the student will not be on-campus
- Registering for courses is a different procedure-- See VLA website. Hebron Counselors will help with this process.
- Blended - 12th grade Gov & Econ



Gifted & Talented

- Curriculum is Honors and AP
- Number of sections created in Master Schedule for “Designated GT” is based on Student Course Request
- Scheduling courses can be very limiting if student requests all courses as “GT”
- All Honors and AP courses have both GT and non-GT students

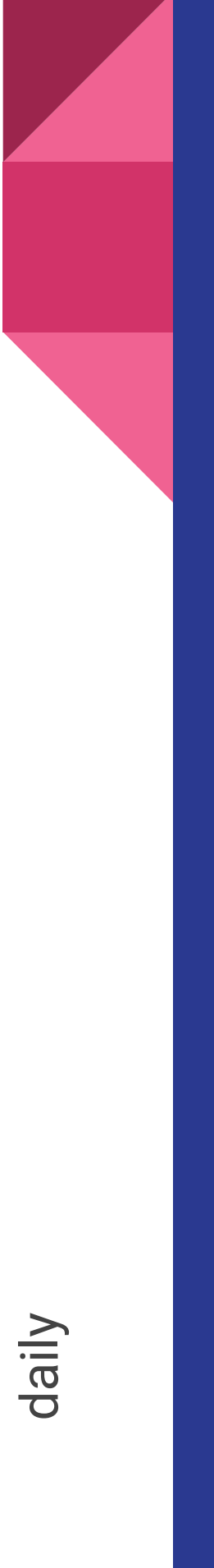
11th Grade - English

11th grade students are required to take English 3. Class can be taken as on-level, Advanced Placement (AP), Humanities AP, VLA, or Dual Credit. English 3 is required for graduation.



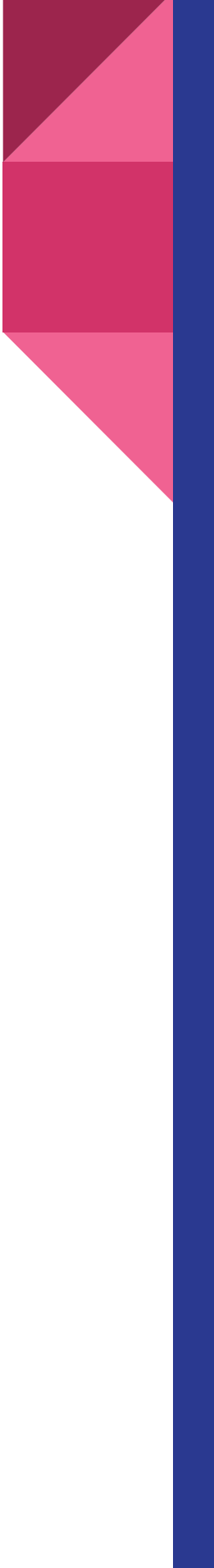
AP English - 11th & 12th Grades

- Focus on critical reading, grammar study, vocabulary enhancement and formal writing through innovative strategies
- The course assumes the ability & willingness of the student to read up to 25 pages independently per day to prepare for class discussions and written assignments
- Class-selected and independently-selected works read daily



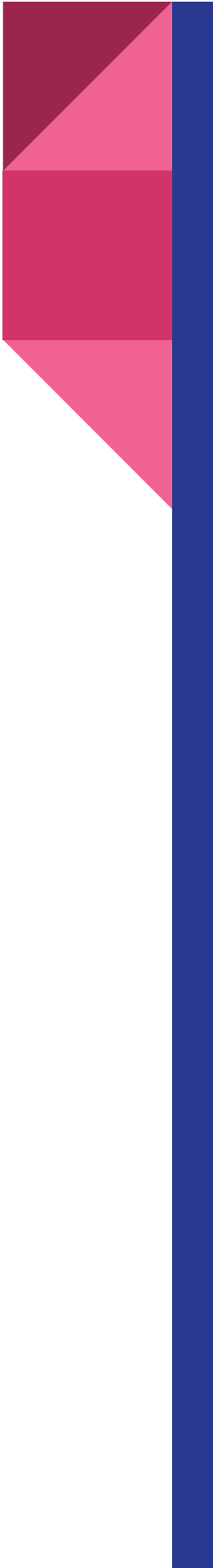
English - 11th Grade

- On-level English 3 – 18 weeks.
- AP English 3 – 18 weeks.
- AP HUMANITIES – English 3AP and US History AP are taught together – 36 weeks alternating days each week.
- VLA – Inside or Outside of the school day.



Dual Credit - 11th Grade

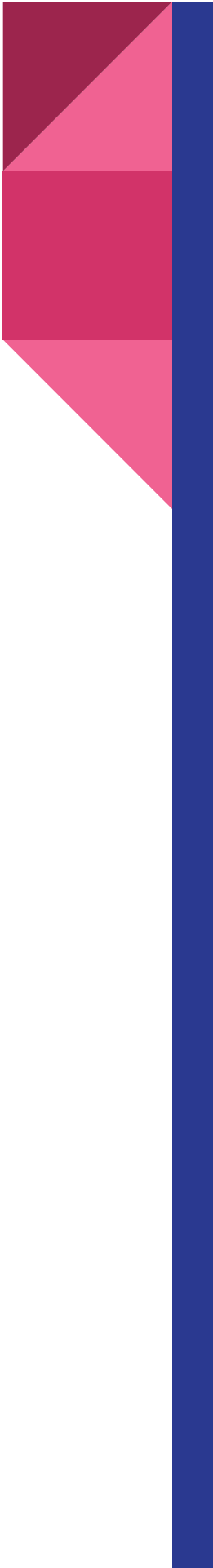
- Dual Credit – offered through Collin College
- English 1301 and 1302 – College Freshman English – 6 hours of college credit. ENG 1301 is fall (.5 credit) and ENG 1302 is spring (.5 credit). Course is taken with HIST 1301 and 1302
- Students register with Collin for courses. Students must register both fall and spring semesters. Several step process and enrollment in the course is completed when payment is made.



English 12th Grade

- On-level English 4 – 18 weeks.
- AP English 4 – 18 weeks.
- VLA – Inside or Outside of the school day.
- Advanced Education (AE) courses – any course under the core

English curriculum can be substituted for English 4.



Dual Credit - 12th Grade

Students that took dual credit English during 11th grade can now take dual credit English for 12th grade credit.

ENGL 2327 – American Lit 1

SPCH 1311 – Intro to Speech Communications

Both these classes will count for full credit of English 4..

Both classes meet core curriculum requirements in college.



11th Grade - US History

- US History is the course all 11th graders must take.
- This course can be taken as on-level, Advanced Placement (AP), Humanities (AP), VLA, or Dual Credit.
- This course is a STAAR (EOC) tested course.
- Both course and EOC must be passed for graduation from high school.



AP US History (APUSH)

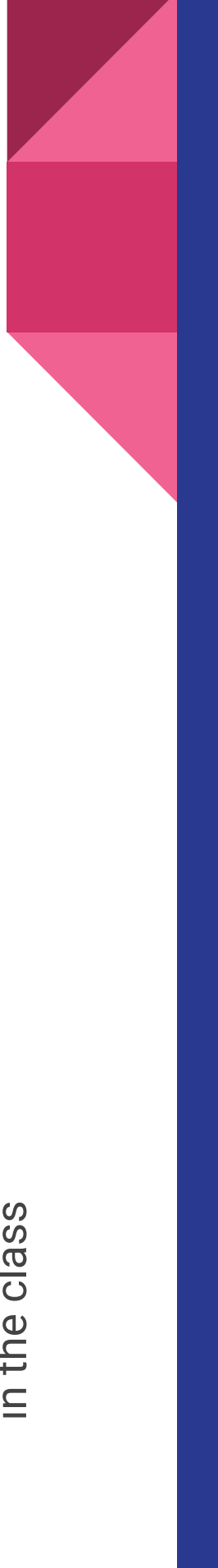
- Designed to have the rigor experienced by a college freshman
- Essay writing, participate in discussions, read documents at the college level
- Course requires a substantial time commitment from students outside of class if they hope to be successful
- First 3-6 weeks of the class are challenging as students learn skills they need to be successful



AP US History (APUSH), con't.

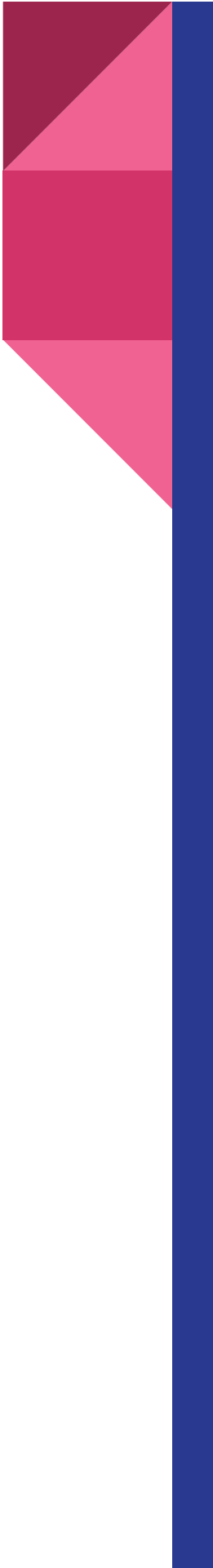
Successful Participants:

- Time management will be the key skill
- Self-motivated
- Enjoys academic challenge
- Study skills and note taking skills at a high level
- Effective reading, making judgements and thinking
- Put 'learning' at an equal to or above the actual number grade earned in the class



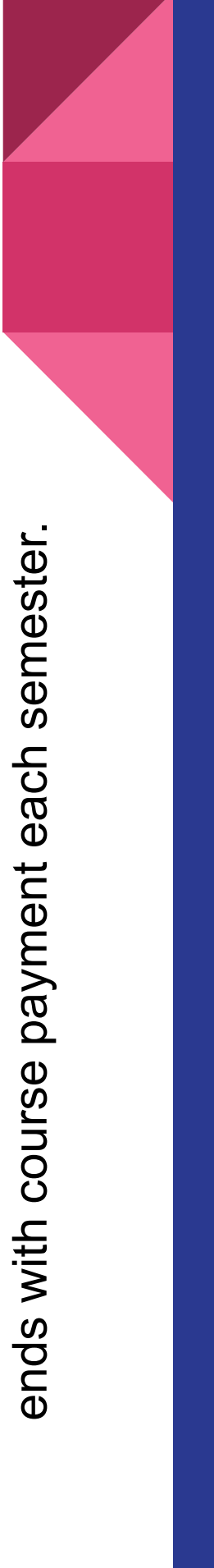
AP US History (APUSH) con't

- AP HUMANITIES – APUSH and English 3AP are taught together – 36 weeks alternating days each week
- VLA – Inside or Outside the school day



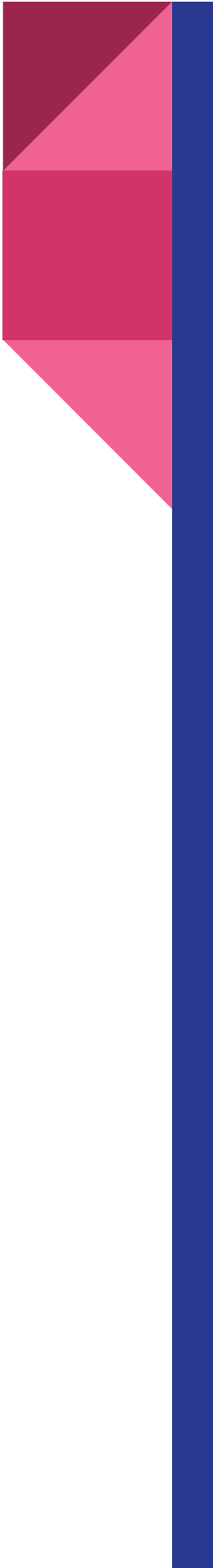
US History - Dual Credit

- Dual Credit – offered through Collin College
- US HISTORY 1301 and 1302 – College US History – 6 college hours.
- HIST 1301 is taken in the fall semester and HIST 1302 is in the spring semester.
- Courses are taken with ENG 1301 and ENG 1302. Students register with Collin for each course. Several step process and ends with course payment each semester.



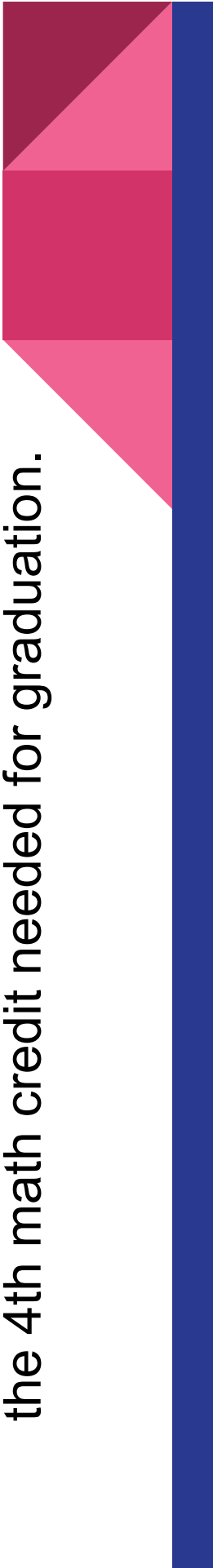
12th Grade - Government & Economics

- Both are needed for graduation and are 9 week courses.
- Courses can be taken as on-level, Advanced Placement (AP), VLA, BlendED, at Hebron, or Dual Credit.
- VLA – Inside or Outside of the school day.
- DUAL CREDIT – Government 2305 and Economics 2301. Courses are taught alternating days M-TH for 18 weeks.



11th/12th Grade Math

- Algebra 2 will need to be taken after geometry and will count as the 3rd math credit toward the 4 credits needed for graduation.
- Math Models taken after Geometry will count as the 3rd math credit toward graduation.
- Math courses after Math Models or Algebra 2 will count as the 4th math credit needed for graduation.



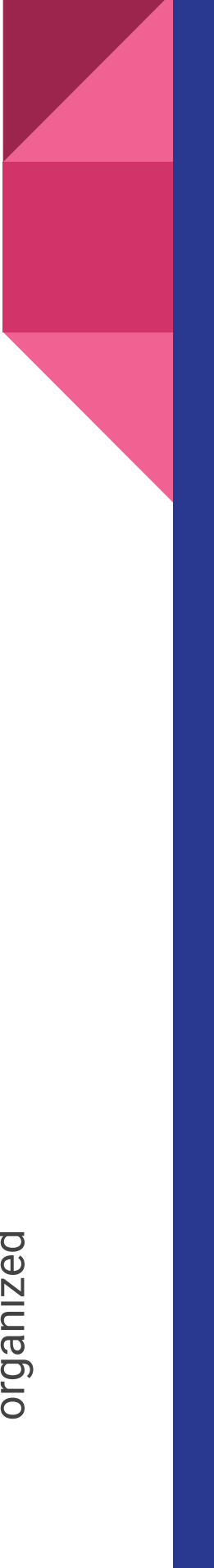
Honors Algebra 2

- Recommendation is 90 or better in regular Algebra 1, or 85 or better in Algebra 1 PreAP
- Not recommended for students who took Algebra AB all year
- Summer Assignment - there are assignments based on the summer assignment at the start of the term, regardless of if the class is scheduled fall or spring
- In-depth in each concept and is more application-based
- Tests are free-response (No multiple choice)



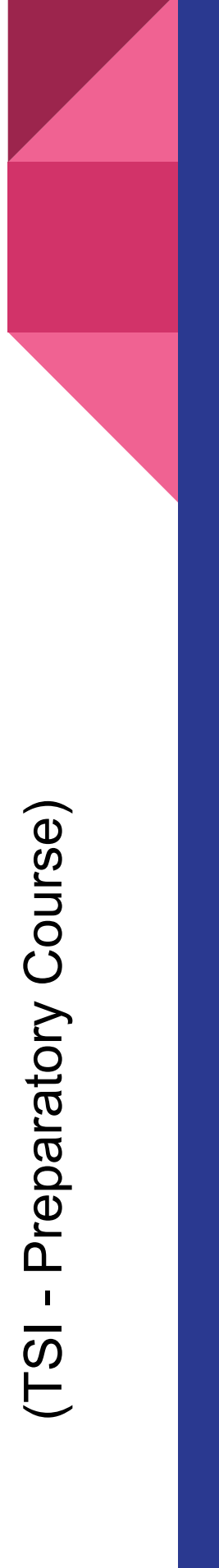
Honors Algebra 2, con't.

- Calculators are not commonly used, and students are required to show all work on tests
- Review problems cover the same concepts learned in the unit, but they are not the same questions on the exams
- Same homework as regular Algebra 2, but with supplemental work that goes more in-depth
- Successful students have a strong work ethic, are self-motivated and organized



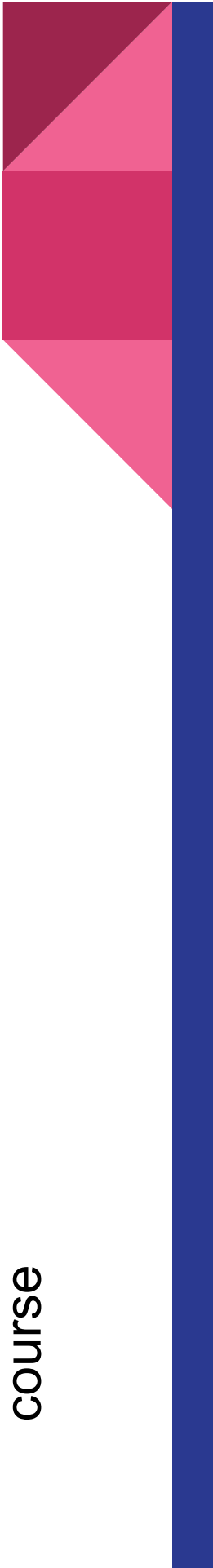
Pre-Calculus / College Prep Math

- PRECAL Honors/GT – students wanting to continue into Calculus AP.
- PRECAL – looking at majoring in a math heavy field in college.
- COLLEGE PREP – students wanting to strengthen their algebra skills in preparation for entry-level college math coursework. This class can not be taken after PreCal.
(TSI - Preparatory Course)



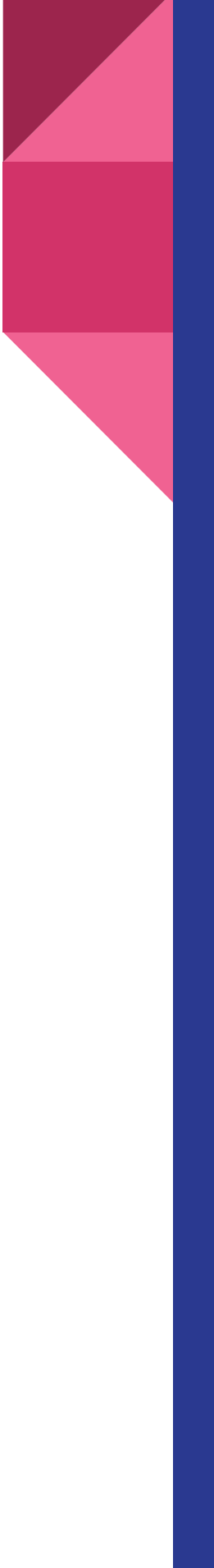
Calculus / Statistics

- Calculus AB AP/GT and Calculus BC AP – Courses can be taken one semester or all year.
- Statistics AP – alternate choice for higher level math for students not wanting Calculus.
- Statistics On-Level – alternate choice for math for students not wanting to take an AP-level mathematics course



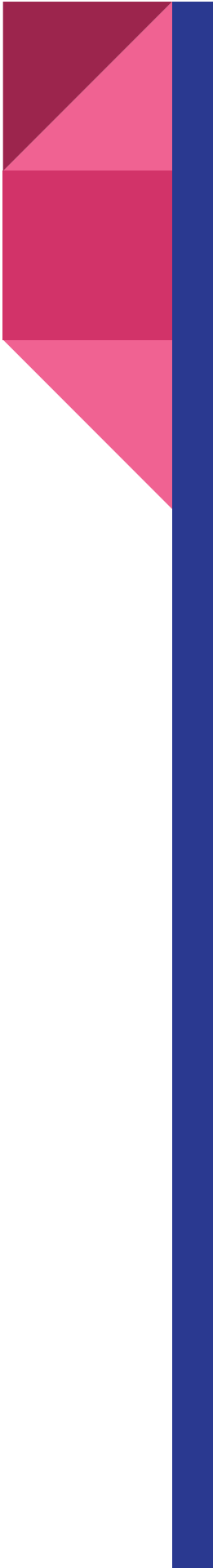
Dual Credit Math

- Four math courses are offered through Collin College - see District Course Description Guide
- MATH 1342 - Elementary Statistical Methods will be taught at Hebron in the fall term.



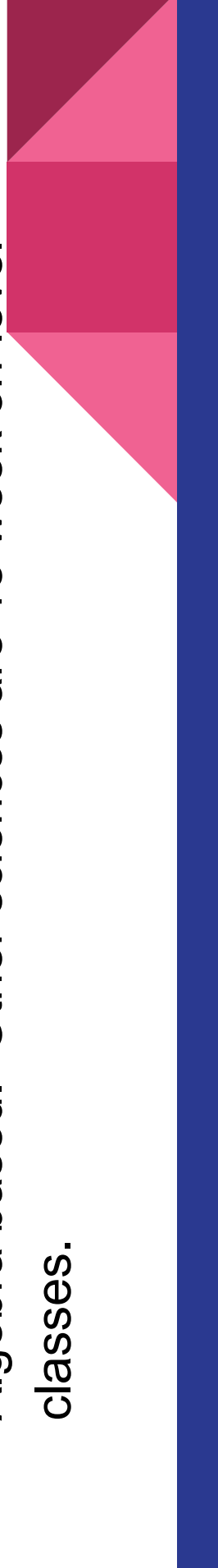
11th/12th Grade Science

- A science credit is needed in both 11th and 12th grades. One credit in 11th grade, and 1 credit in 12th grade.
- Science classes can be taken as on-level, Honors, or AP.



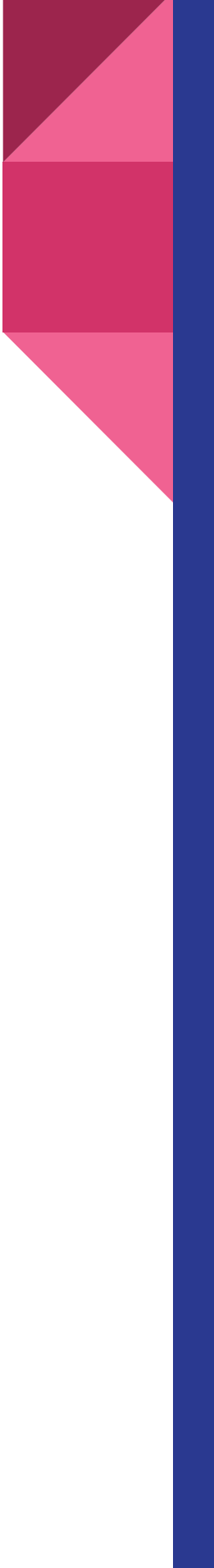
Honors / AP Sciences

- AP CHEMISTRY, AP BIOLOGY, & AP PHYSICS C - 36 weeks – students take classes all year. Curriculum is very rigorous.
- AP PHYSICS 1, AP PHYSICS 2 and AP ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE – 18 weeks
- PHYSICS C is Calculus based and PHYSICS 1 & 2 are Algebra based. Other sciences are 18 week on-level classes.



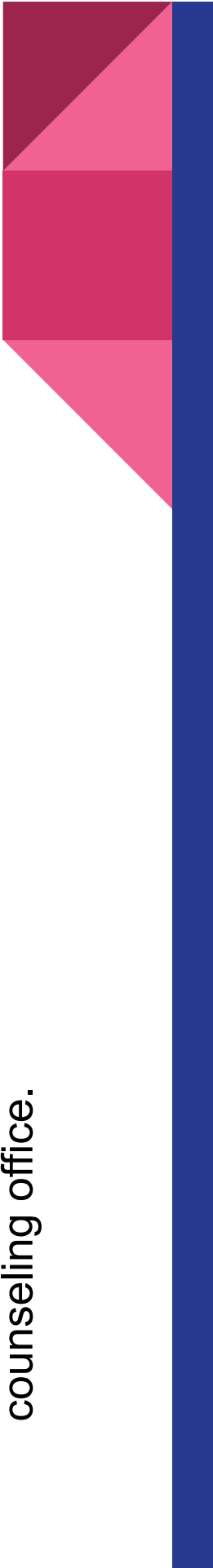
TECC-E / TECC-W

- Formerly Dale Jackson and Career Center East
- All TECC-E and TECC-W classes are blocked for 2 class periods.
- Student will take either 1st and 2nd period or 3rd and 4th periods at TECC-E and TECC-W.
- Many great elective courses are offered at both Centers with options of certifications at the completion of some courses.



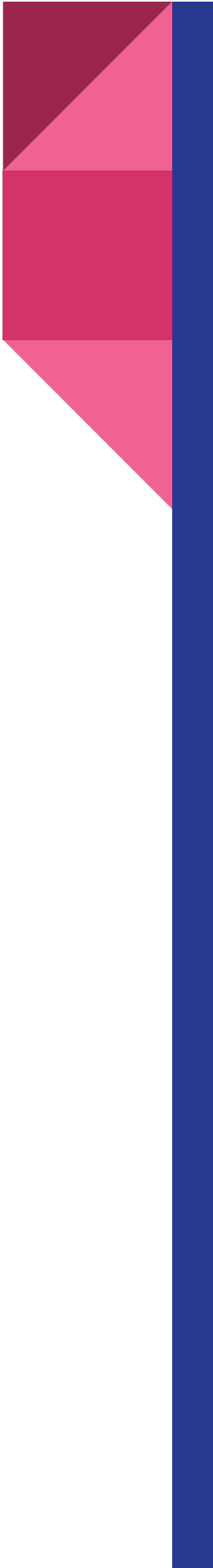
NCTC Dual Credit

- Hebron students also have opportunity to enroll in North Central Texas College (NCTC) for two dual credit programs.
 - Firefighter Program – classes taught at LHS
 - Cybersecurity Program-classes taught at TECC-W
- Both programs are all year programs for both 11th and 12th grade years. Certification can be earned at the end of the 12th grade.
- More information about these programs can be found in the Hebron counseling office.



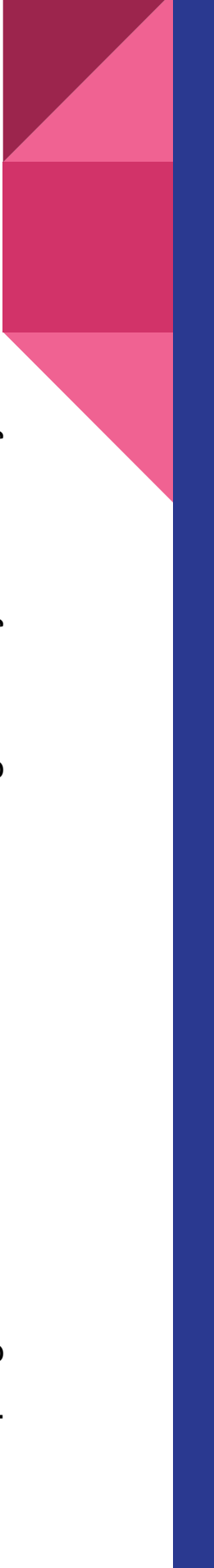
PSAT & SAT Classes

- PSAT CLASS is by invitation based on score from PSAT 10th grade year.
- PSAT test taken October of 11th grade year determines National Merit status and can be beneficial for scholarships and college.
- Registration and payment for test is required.
- Class is the first 9 weeks in the fall and summer participation is required.
- SAT CLASS is open to any 11th or 12th grade student.
 - Recommend either having completed Algebra 2 or being concurrently enrolled in it.



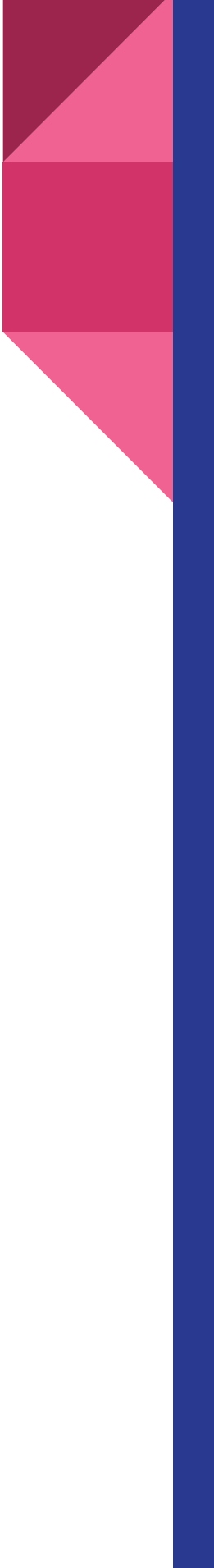
SAT or ACT

- Either test needs to be taken for most college admissions - Community colleges do not require
- Registration:
 - SAT - www.collegeboard.org
 - ACT - www.actstudent.org
- Suggested to take spring of 11th grade year for the first time
- Tests are certain Saturdays during the school year. Hebron is not a testing site.
- Test fee waivers are available for students on the Free and Reduced Lunch program. These are available starting Junior year. See your Counselor.




College Visits

- 11th & 12th grade students may participate in college visits for up to 2 school days per academic year.
- College visits are excused with proper documentation.
- Contact attendance office for documentation requirements.



Student/Counselor Conference

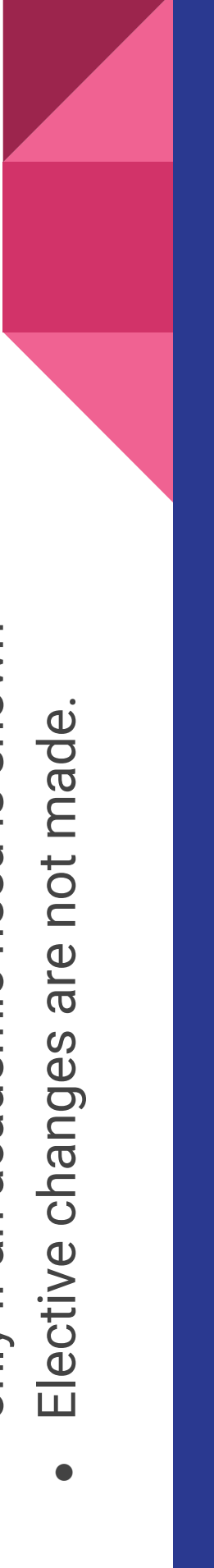
All students will have an opportunity to update/change their course requests during Course Verification, which is tentatively scheduled for May 3-7. Students whose requests are incomplete will meet with either the one of 9th Grade Counselors, main campus Counselor, or a TECC Counselor, depending on where they attend classes between 2/21-3/29. All students will have the opportunity to sign up for a brief individual meeting with their Counselor between 3/29-4/9.



Change Policies

Schedules are set for the year. Once school begins:

- If there is an error in the schedule or a program change, schedules will be adjusted.
- Teacher requests are not accepted.
- Change out of Honors or AP will be at the 9 weeks and only if an academic need is shown
- Elective changes are not made.
