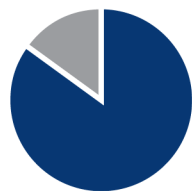

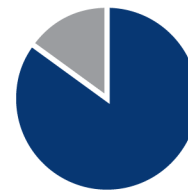
Percent of students whose test scores indicate they are college and career ready.



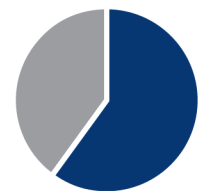

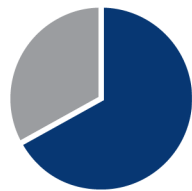

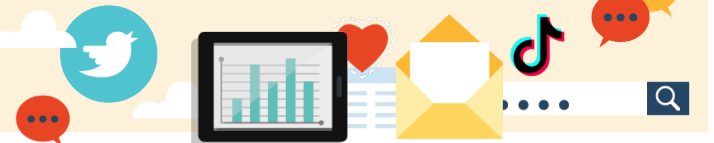
CLUBS
