# LHS Leadership/PALS Class Code of Conduct



Three demerits, skipping mentoring, bullying, cyber-bullying, proof of use of alcohol or drugs, any revealing images, videos or inappropriate tweets or posts will result in automatic removal from class or office.

In today's society, each person is judged on their own personal merit, so each of the common-sense rules of society are listed here today. The leadership guidelines are guidelines that businesses will follow and each of the rules are great to continue to follow even when you graduate. Each student in the leadership class must abide by the following guidelines. The student and parent must both sign the form and return it to Mrs. Stamey within two days. Each student must be aware of their position in LHS and understand that they are role models, leaders and mentors and must act accordingly. This class is selected based on application and any student may be removed at any time if they bring a negative image to this program or this school.

#### Guidelines we must all follow:

- I will respect my fellow students, rules, and regulations as I respect myself.
- I will communicate with others to help unite my school.
- I will help eliminate the use of violence as an answer to problems and become a good citizen
  of my school.
- I will demonstrate respect for my school campus.
- I will display good sportsmanship and school spirit at all times.
- I will have reverence for my own beliefs and respect those of others.
- I will not complain about the problems in my school but will work to improve my school.

As a selected leader of Lewisville High School, your actions in school and at all school related activities are expected to reflect the title that you hold, student leader. Additionally, you are accountable for your behavior on your own time whether it becomes a legal matter or you have chosen to break our leadership guidelines. As a student leader at LHS, you must not be seen drinking alcohol, using drugs, smoking, or showing behavior that is not becoming of a leader. You must leave any parties if alcohol or drugs are present. Keep all talk of sexuality or any experiences of that nature out of your conversations with other students. Behavior that is not worthy of emulation (such as but not limited to: scamming, lying, stealing, vandalism, drug use, actions hazardous to oneself or others) is unacceptable. Consequences will be determined by Student Council advisors, Allison Stamey and Dan Moser, the Executive Board; and/or the Judiciary Board with input from the administration when necessary. Failure to comply may result in one or more of the following (extenuating circumstances will be reviewed):

**ISS** – If a student is sent to ISS, the circumstances will be reviewed and the student will either be removed from class, or given a demerit. Automatic removal would be any offense that lasts for more than 1 day in ISS. Any AEP or JJAEP consequences will be automatic removal.

**Leaving LHS without Permission:** You may not ever leave LHS without the permission of Mrs. Stamey or Mr. Moser. You must come and sign out and state where you are going. If there is a substitute, you must ask the permission of the Student Council President first, if he/she is not available, the Vice President and so on can give permission. Only a Student Body officer can give permission if a substitute is in the room. You do not have to do this if mentoring because we know where you are.

Bullying, Cyber bullying, cussing and behavior on social networks: At no time will any leadership class member cuss or speak badly of the school, our students, or anyone, regardless of what is happening on any social network. KEEP YOUR DRAMA TO YOURSELVES AND REPRESENT THIS PROGRAM WELL. If we have proof that any of this has taken place, you will have consequences. A demerit will be given for a minor infraction and a warning given. If any inappropriate tweets, posts, bullying or cyberbullying take place the students involved will be automatically removed from the class/program.

**Posting Images: Do not post any questionable images on social networks**. Automatic removal or demerits will be given. The advisors will determine consequences.

**Time off campus:** During your driving time to schools, you need to go directly to the school or designated place and return back to school. You may not stop home or go to restaurants or shop. If you need to stop by home to pick up uniform, etc. on the way back from mentoring, you must contact Mrs. Stamey or Mr. Moser to let us know. We MUST know where you are the entire class time. If your school sends you away early, you must come back to school. FOLLOW THAT SCHOOL'S DRESS CODE.

**Driving to Mentoring –** ALWAYS BE SAFE!! Follow the law. Only licensed drivers may drive with insurance and there must be a seat belt for every passenger in the vehicle. Drive the speed limit and be cautious. You are riding at your own risk.

Missing Mentoring/Misbehaving at mentoring – skipping mentoring or not behaving properly with the feeder students for any reason will be an automatic removal from class. If you are sick and will miss mentoring, you must contact the school where you mentor that morning and tell the counselor you won't be present. You must also call or text Mrs. Stamey. Failure to notify will result in removal from class. Please don't miss mentoring. Show up unless you are very ill. Do not schedule college visits or doctor/dentist visits during the days you mentor. Young children rely on you to be there for mentoring. If you are absent, it ruins that child's entire day, or week. Sometimes you are all that child has to look forward to in life. Do NOT ever eat off the student's lunch plate or show your cell phone while mentoring. Also, do not log into the networks at the schools. Your job is to give 100% to that student or the class you mentor. If you are released early from mentoring, you must return to school. Do not go home or to restaurants.

**Not attending Student Council Activities** – All students in class must attend 85% of Student Council activities each month to remain in the class, and must not miss more than one meeting per month. If you are a committee chairperson or officer, you must be present to present your reports.

**Outside of School** – If poor behavior/choices are reported to LHS from a party or event outside of school, you will be called into a meeting to find out what happened. If it is proven that you made poor choices (as listed above), you will be removed from the class and will not receive honor cords, or have your name highlighted in the graduation program. Your parents and or coaches/sponsors will also be notified.

**Failure to work in class** – If it is reported to the advisor that you are failing to do the assigned work in leadership class, you will be called in for a meeting. Officers will guide you on what needs to be done and you must do projects as part of the class.

**Students/Farmer Pride** – Each student must dress up on spirit days. They must also support all projects and activities and speak only positively of their fellow Student council members. Demerits will be given accordingly.

# Central Zone Mentoring/Service Off-Campus Permission LEWISVILLE HIGH SCHOOL

#### Dear Parent/Guardian:

Some of the activities related to the Student Council/PALS at Lewisville High School occur off campus during the school day. For example, students may leave campus for the following: Mentoring, Service Projects or events, or to pick up of supplies for Homecoming or Prom, or other times student leaders are needed around the community.

These off campus activities are optional and not a group requirement. Permission to leave and drive off campus is left to parental discretion. If you would like to authorize your student to leave campus for such activities, then you may give your permission by signing below and have our notary onsite witness your signature. If you do not wish to give your permission, no adverse action such as discipline, grade docking, or lowered evaluation will result from your choice, however, the student may choose another class that doesn't mentor.

Students with permission shall provide their own transportation or ride with another responsible student to and from such activities. Each student is expected to comply with all laws and District policies with respect to his/her driving and vehicle. The District shall not be liable for any injuries or damages that may occur as a result of students driving to and from such off campus activities. Students must never skip mentoring after they check in or strong consequences will take place and the student will be removed from the class.

Students shall comply with all school rules when representing Lewisville High School off campus and may be disciplined for non-compliance. Students shall follow all school procedures for obtaining, using and returning an off-campus pass that must only be used with approval by the teachers/advisors. While off campus, students shall only engage in authorized activities related to their group. Students shall travel directly to the designated off campus destination(s), complete their activities and then directly return to the campus within the required time. Students will not receive a note to excuse a tardy if they are late to their next class. Failure to meet these expectations may result in a loss of off-campus privileges and/or removal from the Student Leadership/PALS class.

Please help us emphasize to your student the importance of abiding by all the rules of this off-campus privilege. We have great faith in these students and feel they will conduct themselves in a safe and admirable manner. Please go over safety procedures listed on the following page. Remind them every student in the vehicle must wear seat belts and the driver should follow the speed limit. If a mentor receives a speeding ticket or gets into an accident, please notify me immediately.

By filling out the form on the following page and having it signed by a notary, you give permission for your child to leave campus and drive himself/herself and possibly other students to and from the destinations for the off campus activities related to the group as long as your child is a student at LHS.

#### Safety Guidelines for Teen Drivers

#### 1) Wear Seat Belts!

If there is no seat belt for you, do NOT ride in that vehicle. See Stamey, Moser or Lindamood.

#### 2) Keep Your Cell Phone Off

Multiple studies indicate using a cell phone while driving is the **equivalent of driving drunk**—that's even when using a hands-free phone.

#### 3) Don't Text

Research shows texting—on average—causes a **loss of focus on the road for 4.6 seconds**. You can drive the length of a full football field in that time. A *lot* can go wrong while you drive the length of a football field without your eyes on the road. Don't try the "texting-while-stopped" approach, either, as **many states ban texting while behind the wheel**. And, when you have your head down, you won't notice key developments that may occur. Remember, you still need to pay attention to the road when you're stopped.

#### 4) Obey the Speed Limit

Speeding is a **major contributor to fatal teen accidents**. That's especially true when driving on roads with lots of traffic or with which you're not familiar.

Don't feel pressured to keep up with traffic if it seems like everyone else is flying by you. Driving a safe speed helps ensure your well-being, and keeps you away from costly traffic tickets that can increase insurance costs.

#### 5) Minimize Distractions

It may be tempting to eat, drink, flip around the radio dial, or play music loudly while you're cruising around town; however, all can cause your mind or vision to wander, even for a few seconds. As an inexperienced driver, you are **more apt to lose control of your car**. Distractions can significantly increase the chances that you 1) not notice impending danger or notice it too late and 2) lose the ability to control the vehicle.

#### **6) Practice Defensive Driving**

Always be aware of the traffic ahead, behind, and next to you, and have possible escape routes in mind. Stay at least one car length behind the car in front of you at slower speeds, and maintain a larger buffer zone with faster speeds.
