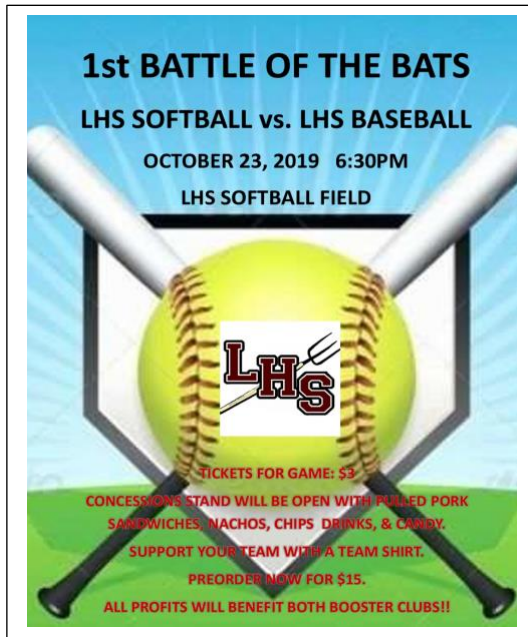
### **Boys Basketball Tryouts**

### Food Deliveries to Students

To minimize instructional interruptions and maintain school safety, LISD has established the following procedures:

- Deliveries may only be made by a student's parent/guardian.
- Parent/guardian must call the school if a delivery is going to be made by someone other than themselves.
- Deliveries must be secured and labeled with the student's name and grade level
- Students can pick-up non-food delivered items only before/after school and during passing periods.
- Students will not be called out of class for deliveries.
- Students will be allowed to come to the office during their lunch passing period to pick-up their food.
- Harmon will not be responsible for lost or stolen lunches
- **Food deliveries from a restaurant or delivery service are NOT permitted under any circumstances.**

### **Student Drivers**

Students can only drive to and from Main/Killough if they have a 1<sup>st</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> period class there. Students are not permitted to drive other students at any time.

- Parking is limited to the front parking lot between the yellow parking spaces.
- Need proof of insurance, license, and \$5.
- Parking sticker works for all of the LHS Triad campuses.
- Come to our front office to register your vehicle.
