• Lewisville High School was established in 1897, making it LISD's oldest high school.


There are over 4,400 LHS students (LISD's largest high school) on three different campuses, known as The Triad:

- ★ LHS Main



- Everyone makes mistakes. Take responsibility for yours, and use them as a learning opportunity.
- Be proactive instead of reactive.
- Help to resolve issues rather than create them, and practice kindness every day
- •Bring your iPad to school every day.

- •Be a positive influence on others at all times—we don't have time for drama.



SHUTTLES



Students with classes at other campuses are dismissed five minutes early to board the shuttles buses.

Check the bell schedule posters for shuttle times. There are shuttles going to other campuses every period and before & after school.

Classes are still in session. Go directly to class or the bus without being disruptive or loud.

 The shuttle to LHS after school is only for students who need to go to Main for athletics, rehearsals, or tutoring. Your teacher, coach, or director will give you a pass.




- IPads: You are required to bring your district-owned iPad to school every day. Misusing an iPad will mean that you lose the privilege of having one.
- Cell phones: Use phones during passing periods and lunch. Teachers decide if phones can be used in class. Unless a teacher gives you permission, your cell phone is to be put away in your pocket or backpack.
- •Ear buds/headphones: You may wear <u>one</u> in the hallways. No ear buds/headphones allowed in classrooms unless given permission by teacher.



- •Hallway behavior: Use your passing periods & block lunch to talk with friends, and use your cell phone. No screaming, yelling, running or horseplay.
- •15/15 Rule: You are not allowed to leave the classroom during the first and last 15 minutes of each period, except to go to the shuttle bus at the end.
- Attendance: You can earn passing grades in your classes, but still fail if you don't attend school. You can only miss 4 days per Nine Weeks.
- If you are absent, you must get an Admit Slip from the Attendance Office <u>before</u> school starts and give it to each of your teachers. If you wait until after school starts, you will be marked tardy.

TARDIES



Come straight to the library to get a tardy slip.

Consequences:

+1-2: Warning

+3-5: One Lunch Detention per tardy.

+6-8: A week of Block Lunch PASS

+9+: One day of PASS per tardy.





IF THE DOOR IS CLOSED & LOCKED, YOU ARE <u>TARDY</u>

This class has started.
A tardy slip is given in the library.
Return to class with a tardy slip.
Demonstrate respect upon arrival.
You are responsible for missed material.

You will not be allowed into class without a tardy slip, admit slip, or office pass.



IDs: all students and staff are required to have IDs around their necks and visible at all times. Student IDs will be handed out this week. See ID Policy posters in halls for more information.

+If you forget yours, you buy a temporary sticker for \$1 in the library <u>before</u> school starts.

+We must be able to see your picture and name; do not mark out or put stickers over your face.

Responding to adults: We expect all students to be respectful at all times. When an adult asks you to do something, you are expected to comply immediately and without an attitude or talking back.

• Dress Code: We want all LHSK students to be dressed for success every day.

- Common issues:
 - +Not wearing ID
 - +Holes above the knee
 - +Sagging—pants must be at the waistline with no underwear showing.
 - +Tights/leggings
 - +Piercings/nose rings
 - +Nike shorts
 - +Visible tattoos
 - +Hair color or designs cut in the hair or eyebrows

Full dress code is on the LHS Killough & LISD websites.





•Dress Code:

- +Staff determines whether or not a student is in compliance.
- +We do not give students clothes. You will get one warning and opportunity to change. If that is not possible, you will spend the day in PASS.
- +Continued violations will result in immediate placement in PASS.

You are required to know and follow dress code every day.

CONSEQUENCES FOR NOT FOLLOWING THE RULES





- •Lunch detention (small gym):
 - +Assigned by the office for misbehavior or tardies.
- Block Lunch PASS (room 105):
 - +Assigned by APs for misuse of block lunch or other misbehavior.
- PASS (In-school suspension):
 - +Assigned by APs.



INTERACTING WITH STAFF



- Be respectful at all times—we are all here to make sure you are safe, happy, and learning.
- There will be times that you have a conflict with a teacher or staff member.
- •Keep calm! You will always have a chance to tell your side of the story.
- •Do not get argumentative or disrespectful—that only makes the situation worse.
- •Your AP is always here to help talk through the issues.
- •Take responsibility for mistakes and learn from them.

SAFETY



- Safety of students and staff is our number one priority.
- •All students & staff are required to wear picture IDs at all time.
- Never open the exterior doors for anyone—all visitors must enter through the front office.
- Exit only through the main front and back doors, including after school and for shuttles.
- •We will practice safety drills regularly throughout the year. Please take them serious and listen to teachers' instructions.

OTHER INFO



- Exit through the front doors if you are walking or waiting for a ride home. Building should be clear by 3:45.
- •If you ride a bus, go to the small gym.
- Once you leave the building, you are not allowed to come back in unless you check in through the front office.
- The after school shuttle bus to LHS load on the north end (past the cafeteria). <u>A PASS IS REQUIRED TO RIDE THE BUS!</u>
- •We do not save spots in the lunch lines. Get in line with your friends at the same time or just go to the end and meet up later.
- Important policies & procedures are on posters in the hallways.

FORMS AND IPAD FEES



- <u>ALL</u> students must complete forms through Skyward.
- Ice iPad fees are loaded in Skyward now. Log in to pay online or pay Ms. Houpy in the office.
- Students without forms will go to Block Lunch PASS until completed, and students with unpaid iPad fees will have their iPads taken.
