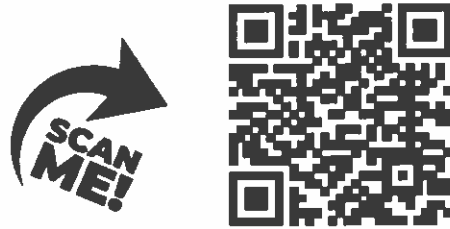

How to register in Skyward Video

Part 1

Step 1: Go to SCHEDULE in your STUDENT SKYWARD.

Step 2: Select across the top COURSE REQUESTS 2024-2025

Step 3: Using your Course Cards, transfer your courses of interest to COURSE REQUESTS 2024-2025.

Step 4: Using Course Numbers provided on your course cards, select courses for next year from the right column and select ADD. (Course cards: LHS-Main, Career Center, and Virtual Learning Academy)

Step 5: Once selected and added, course will populate to left column.

Step 6: Once 8 credits worth of courses are entered, you are done with selecting your main courses.

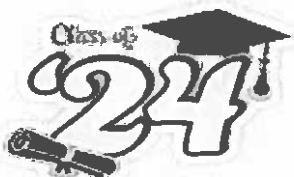
Step 1: Select across the top REQUEST ALTERNATE

Step 2: Using the same process, select 4 more credits worth of courses of Alternates.

Alternates are an additional 4 courses needed that you would be interested in taking.
In many cases these courses used in your future schedule.

Step 3: You are DONE, if you have selected 8 credit and 4 alternates. There is not a save button.

Courses add to your future schedule are automatically saved once added to SELECTED COURSES in Skyward.
