Hold Harmless 2020–21

- ▶ Second half of school year
- ▶ In-person attendance is the determining factor.
- ▶ Federal Stimulus Money
 - ▶ 1st Round – Last year – \$ into formulas
 - ▶ 2nd Round – \$17 Million
 - ▶ 3rd Round – \$37.5 Million (ESSER 3)
 - ▶ 20% must go towards learning loss
 - ▶ Can look back and look forward

Looking Ahead to Fiscal 2021–22

- ▶ Property values
 - ▶ 9% Growth projected
 - ▶ \$1 Billion new property on rolls
- ▶ Enrollment trends
 - ▶ Flat enrollment
 - ▶ Modest virtual component for SY 2021–22
- ▶ Staff attrition – COVID (PK–2), 2/3 back next fall
- ▶ Recapture
- ▶ HB 3

Looking Ahead to Fiscal 2021–22

- ▶ LISD Tax Rate

	<u>M + O</u>	<u>I + S</u>	<u>Total</u>
▶ 2020–21	\$0.9664	\$0.3809	\$1.3473
▶ 2021–22	M + O to go down	\$0.3809	

Legislature is in Session

- ▶ Texas Economy
 - ▶ Driven by oil and gas – price of crude
 - ▶ State Deficit – much lower – near zero, now surplus
 - ▶ Ability to maintain HB 3 gains to public education – so far, so good
- ▶ Impact of HB 3 to LISD recapture – State House and State Senate agreed in principle to extend.
- ▶ HB 3 impact on LISD recapture was as follows:
 - ▶ Fiscal Year 2019 \$30 Million (Audited)
 - ▶ Fiscal Year 2020 \$16 Million (Audited)
 - ▶ Fiscal Year 2021 \$32 Million (Budgeted)
 - ▶ Fiscal Year 2022 \$50+ Million (Projected)
