

CCMR—What is it?

- College, Career & Military Readiness
 - We want students to have a plan
 - Do you have ideas of things you want to learn after high school?
 - Are you applying to schools or training programs that can teach you those things?
 - Are you linked up with a recruiter?
 - Are you preparing to maximize your earning potential?
- Important component of how schools and districts are evaluated
- Credits, Endorsements and STAAR passage are “graduation requirements”
- Every student completing a CCMR indicator is a “graduation goal”
- Could impact your student during high school or immediately after depending on their goals

CCMR—How to meet it?

Students need to meet 1 of the following criteria by the time they graduate

- Score 3 on any AP Exam in grades 9-12
- Complete Dual Credit Courses
 - 3 hours of Dual Credit English or Math OR
 - 9 hours of Dual Credit across any subject
- Complete an aligned CTE Program of Study which includes...
 - Complete 3 or more courses for 4+ credits
 - Earn credit in 1+ Level 3 or Level 4 course
 - Earn the culminating Industry-Based Certification in the Program of Study
- Enlist in the US Armed Forces or the TX National Guard
- Students receiving Special Education services complete an endorsement


Phase 1: Exploration

Now through 1st Day of School

College Websites - What to look for?

- Admission requirements for freshmen and/or transfer students
- Does the college provide the degree you're wanting to pursue?
- Application and scholarship deadlines
- College representative - *get in contact with your admissions counselor.*
- Check if school accepts Dual Credit and AP scores taken in high school
- Mailing list and social media links

College Visits

- Sign up for an official college visit/tour/information session
- 2 free excused absences during junior and senior year for college visits and job shadowing. Must bring back signed note/letter from admissions office with date of visit and school logo.
- Many colleges visit Marcus during lunch

TSI (Texas Success Initiative)

- ❖ The Texas Success Initiative (TSI) measures the ability of students, as indicated by their skills in Reading, Writing and Math, to do college-level coursework.
- ❖ No matter what college or university students attend, TSI (or school equivalent) is required for students to take before registering for college courses.
- ❖ TSI can be taken at the college or university the student plans to attend, or any college that allows outside testers. UNT in Denton and NCTC are schools that allow students to take TSI regardless if student attends their school or not. **Marcus hosts TSI testing for students in English 3, Algebra 2, and College Prep Math...and in the spring semester for Seniors who sign up.**
- ❖ Exemptions: Students can be exempt from taking TSI based off of SAT or ACT scores. Check specific college or university websites for exemption qualifications.

Marcus offers School Day Testing (SAT, ACT, TSI)

- LISD pays for every student to take ONE School Day exam while at Marcus.
 - **NOTE:** If you use a free test, students can still pay and take the School Day tests offered at Marcus.
- Marcus offers SAT School Day during the Fall Semester to seniors only.
 - Students **MUST** register by the deadline.
- Marcus offers ACT School Day during the Spring semester for juniors and seniors.
 - Students **MUST** register by Deadline
- Marcus offers TSI test day in the Spring semester for seniors only.

Phase 2: Application to College

- Get organized (deadlines, requirements, etc)
- Set an family application goal
 - Could you submit all of your applications by Halloween (10/31)?
- Where you apply...
 - Have what you want to learn about (or the options you are still considering)
 - Could be happy at any of them
 - Have confidence you can be accepted to multiple
 - # of schools vary by student
- How you apply...
 - Apply Texas (applytexas.org)
 - Common Application (commonapp.org)
 - College Website
 - Coalition, Scoir, etc

Applications to College cont'd

- When you apply...
 - Schools may offer one/many options to apply
 - <https://admissions.web.baylor.edu/apply-incoming-freshman>
 - Set a realistic expectation
- Important Vocab terms
 - Early vs early
 - Priority

College Application Requirements

- Check university website for application link and get organized first
- Application
- Essays and/or short answers
 - Opportunity for student to tell their story...stuff not already in the application
 - <https://www.commonapp.org/blog/announcing-2025-2026-common-app-essay-prompts>
- Send ACT/SAT Test Scores
 - Must be sent from the testing institution to the college
 - Community College can use scores to be exempt from the TSI
- Recommendation letters
 - Check to see if this is required
 - Provide teacher, or counselor senior brag sheet/resume 2 weeks before
- Resume (good to have but may not be required)
- Interview (more rare)
- Fee
- Official Transcript
 - Request official transcript through the **Transcript Request Link** on MHS website
 - Registrar in A103 if you have any questions
 - Send transcript after you submit your application

RANK Opt-Out on Transcript

Two window opportunities to have rank removed from transcript:

- May 15-30 (end of junior year)
- September 1-15(beginning senior year)

Once the rank is removed from the transcript, it CANNOT go back on.

This is done on the parent portal of Skyward ONLY.

***Note: if you are in the top 10%, rank cannot be removed from your transcript.**

General Information:

Lewisville Independent School District is now offering a secure website for corporations, post-secondary institutions and military recruiters to request student records online.

Transcript policy and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) student records are only releasable to those who have authorization from the student or parent, guardian or responsible person if the student is less than 18 years of age. If the student is 18 years of age or older, school records will not be released to a parent, guardian, or responsible person without the student's written consent.

Please note the information below:

- Requests for information must be completed online and will be processed on normal business days during normal business hours (Monday-Friday, 8:00 AM - 4:00 PM).
- Phone, Email and fax requests will no longer be accepted.
- **OFFICIAL transcripts are ONLY sent to colleges/universities/employers. Any student/parent request, will be sent an unofficial copy of the transcript.**
- **Select the 'Final Transcript' box on the form ONLY if you are a graduating senior AND are requesting your final transcript be sent to the college you are attending.**
- High school transcript requests require a copy of the student signed release to be uploaded during the ordering process.
- Education verifications will be delivered to the email address used during the ordering process.
- You will receive emails from scribOnline@scribsoft.com to notify you of the status of your order. It is important you read those emails carefully as additional information may be required to process your request.
- Please allow 7-10 days for processing.
- **Click the appropriate link button to request information.**

Types of Admission

- Automatic
 - Top 10% at all public state universities except UT Austin
 - Top 5% at UT Austin
 - Top 20% at UNT for Eagle Advantage program
- Academic Admission
 - Fit a GPA/SAT or ACT standard
 - Example:

Phase 3: Applying for Financial Aid



Applying for Financial Aid-Step 1

- The first scholarship application you submit is probably your application for admission
 - Example:

- There are some schools that still require a separate scholarship application

- Make sure that you are aware of the freshman scholarship process at each school you apply to. Completing these steps should be step 1

Applying for Financial Aid-Step 2

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

There are four types of federal student aid:

- **Grants**—financial aid that doesn't have to be repaid (unless, for example, you withdraw from school and owe a refund)
- **Scholarships** - Money that is given to students who apply based on academics and other criteria.
- **Work-study**—a work program through which you earn money to help you pay for school
- **Loans**—borrowed money for college or career school; you must repay your loans, with interest

FAFSA application launches December of Senior Year

Each high school senior in a Texas public school district or open enrollment charter school must complete and submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or a Texas Application for State Financial Aid (TASFA) as a state requirement for graduation. [Texas Education Code §28.0256](#) allows a student to opt out of the financial aid application graduation requirement by submitting a signed form that authorizes the student to decline. This opt out form is located in parent access of Skyward in Back to School forms.

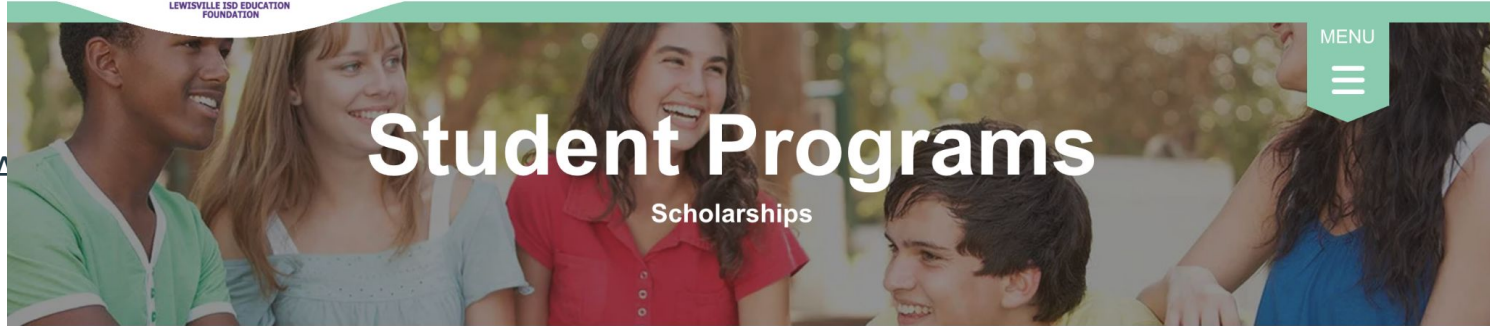

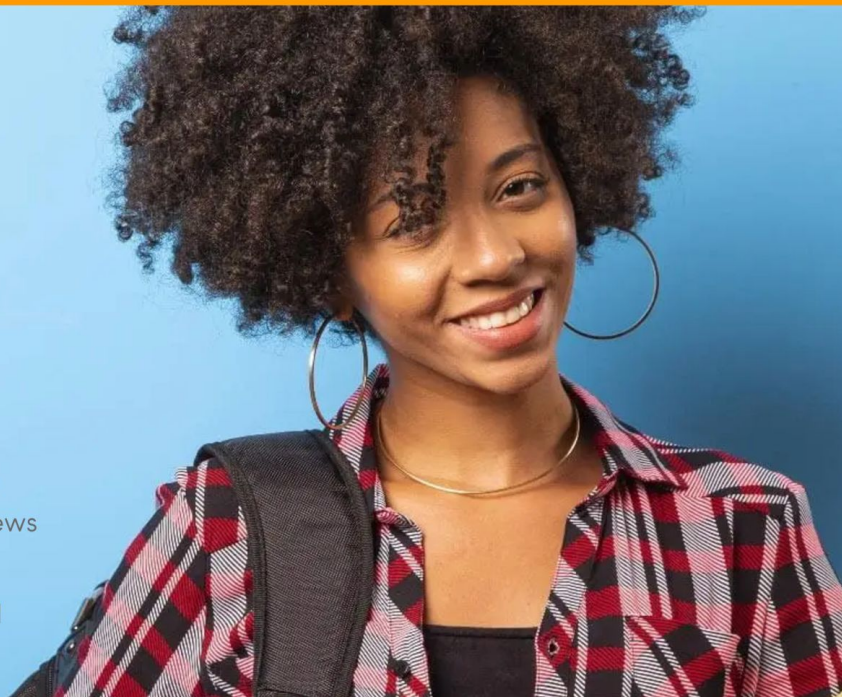
